CLAUDE Bonner Nosworthy was an Anzac veteran who survived the campaigns in Gallipoli, the Middle East, and the Western Front during World War I. However, tragedy struck in 1922 when he died while attempting to rescue swimmers caught in a rip at Maroochydore.

An inquiry revealed the cause of death as a broken neck. He was buried in the Nambour Cemetery. Regarded as a local hero, a substantial monument was erected for him, subscribed by returned soldiers and the local com-

A multimillion-dollar upgrade for a hinterland facility is scoring big points with local sporting clubs described as being "vital to the social fabric of our communities"

Palmwoods Warriors Football Club's headquarters have received a major makeover improving access for all abilities while the adjacent Graeme Rae Oval will receive new

LED ground lighting to support cricket and

The improvements, costing more than half a million dollars were made possible thanks to funding from all three tiers of government.

The Warriors Football Club, Hinterland Blues AFL Club and Palmwoods Cricket Club engage with many thousands of participants.

Division 5 Councillor Winston Johnston said the modern clubhouse included refurbished change areas, canteen, meeting room and office, storage area and public amenities.

"The extensive undercover viewing area is sure to be a crowd pleaser and will provide a massive boost to the sporting clubs for the season and supports sun smart outcomes.

"Overall, it's a win for the Palmwoods sports precinct, with a total of \$2.7 million injected since 2021 when the adjacent Hinterland AFL and Palmwoods cricket clubhouse received a \$1.5 million upgrade."

Nambour equestrian arena gets a million-dollar makeover

SADDLE up Sunshine Coast showjumpers and equestrian enthusiasts, a million-dollar makeover has made our region's largest equestrian arena the 'mane' event.

The Moss Day Pavilion at Nambour Showgrounds has received a refurbished equestrian arena with a new roof and structure over a first-class riding surface and new judges' box.

Sunshine Coast Council Division 10 Councillor David Law said this was an exciting boost for the 14.5 hectare recreational, sporting and events facility to host more, larger and higher-level equestrian events.

"We are 'out of the gate' with the new upgrades which have been warmly welcomed by the region's horse sports community," Cr

Law said.

"The upgrades focused on improving the facilities structure, which was important for the longevity of this major asset for the com-

"When it comes to competing, the all-important judges' box was upgraded to make it more comfortable to assess competitors' agility and performance in the area.

Surface Improvements

"Most importantly, the surface was brought up to a standard which provides support for the horse and rider as well as being shock-absorbent which allows for efficient movement - fantastic for executing flying changes, I've been told.

"On top of these upgrades, other works including timed irrigation, new stormwater and electrical infrastructure have been com-

"While these works were taking place over the past five months, the access stairs and

balustrade in the JD Grimes Grandstand in the showgrounds had a terrific upgrade, important in improving safety and accessibility for visitors.'

Highly credentialled dressage coach and North Coast Active Riders Club member Arianne Nijhuis said the facility upgrade would keep the Sunshine Coast on the map for equestrian competitions.

"It really does put a smile on your face when all the facilities are good, because people from all over Australia will come here to the Sunshine Coast," Arianne said.

"I was born with a love for horses and riding. My daughter is growing up with horses and the love for them is in her blood too.

"She gallops, trots and jumps along everywhere - even without her pony - and loves coming to the showgrounds to either free ride, pony club muster or competitions.

"It is great that Council is willing to upgrade the facilities and the indoor arena gets used lots especially during wet or hot weather.

"It is important for me that I can continue training, especially in the competition season.

"A good surface is also extremely important. There are lots of career ending injuries to horses caused by bad surfaces. The new upgraded surface feels like riding on clouds.

"Big competitions can be held here once again now we have the ground for it.

"The judge's box is a lovely feature for any judged equestrian sport here. It is fantastic to be able to use these facilities and it is affordable.'


"Whether it's footy or cricket, juniors and seniors will now be able to train and play once

"He did his time, he served for the full length of the Gallipoli campaign in the Middle East and the Western Front, and survived unscathed, which was in itself a miracle," said Nambour RSL Secretary Steve

"Then he tragically drowned attempting to save some struggling bathers. And the next day was the day that he was meant to tie up the ownership of a

block of land. He was getting married and going to settle down. So he's gone through the whole of the First World War pretty much unscathed, only for his life to be taken in an accident where he was trying to save others.

'Claude was obviously very well thought of within the community. Because back in 1922

Horse in Gallipoli from early May through to the evacuation. He joined the artillery in Egypt. In April 1916, like many of the Light Horse men, he joined 5th Division (Artillery) Ammunition Column destined for France, variously as driver and gunner. As the guns and wagons were hauled by teams of horses,

to keep the artillery working. From mid-1916, 5th Divisional artillery supported operations at Fromelles and Flers, and the Somme area generally, and then the major Australian operations over 1917 and 1918.

"So it was quite remarkable that he survived really. And it's been a story that's been forgotten even by parts of his family. So when this opportunity came up to tell his story, I feel very proud to be able to do that - privileged."

'Come and help get these women out'

A news report in the Nambour Chronicle in 1922 said the last words Nosworthy, then 31, was heard to say were "Come and help get these women out" to his mate Dave Barclay, a fellow returned serviceman. They were resting on the sand when Nosworthy noticed two ladies and a man in difficulties some distance away.

The report said Nosworthy was the eighth man to enlist in Queensland and survived right through the war without a wound "though in the thickest of it whenever the chance occurred".

"He was claimed to have been the man who was the longest serving of the whole army on Gallipoli. On the evacuation he came away with the last batch.

In France he went into the last big push with his home leave docket in his pocket and came away without most of his mates. After such a death-defying record it is a remarkable instance of fatalism that he should have met death so suddenly."

Local author's journey of 'reverse culture shock'

AUTHOR Teresa Wynne Taylor has a long history with Central Java, Indonesia, where she lived for many years as an English teacher and student of Javanese philosophy and language.

Returning to Australia in 2017 she suffered reverse culture shock. "Apart from missing rice dishes on a daily basis I went from a group oriented society back to a more individualistic

However, she feels fortunate to have moved to Mapleton, where the local community warmly embraced her and where neighbours share stories, garden produce and cups of tea.



The Showgrounds display will also incorporate robotics so that machinery like the Ferris-Wheel will be turning.



Lucky escape as vehicle smashes into Royal George

WWII memories: 'the day I saw a Japanese plane circling hinterland'

AUSTRALIA'S military history is full of stories of courage and heroism in both World Wars but occasionally little-known events come to surface that help us understand how close World War II came to our shores.

As Anzac Day approaches, Nambour resident Tony Bevin recalls the day during World War II he saw a Japanese reconnaissance plane from his family's Burnside farm.


He was just a small boy at the time but has a vivid memory of looking up in the sky and seeing the plane.

"I wasn't much more than a baby," he said. "It circled from Maroochydore up to Mapleton, and it was apparently looking for a suitable site for an airstrip because the Japanese had plans to land at Maroochydore in order to try and take Brisbane."

Tony was one of the few people still alive today who actually saw the

"Children at the school at the time were all told to get in the trenches,' he said. "They had trenches dug at the school, and my brother was in the trench, and he never saw the plane. At the time, I didn't know it was Japanese. I was too young. But you find out these things after the war was over.

"We had soldiers staying on our farm at the top of Carter Road. The farm went down into Burnside. My grandfather grew cane and also had



cows. At the time troops were right up to the house in trenches. We could hear the sirens sounding, and my mum took me downstairs where the soldiers were.

"We were standing with the soldiers and they were looking up, and my mother was looking up. So I looked up too, and I saw the plane. I've got a very good memory.

The military authorities had considered the stretch from Noosa to Caloundra a logical beachhead for an enemy landing, and many soldiers were camped in the area. A military fortification was built on the northern end of Bribie Island to cover the defence of Brisbane and the North West shipping channel.

Mooloolaba beach itself was part of the nation's front line, as the threat of Japanese attack and invasion increased.

Barbed wire on the beach

Tony continued: "I can still remember seeing barbed wire on the beach. Actually, the navy used Mount Coolum as a target during the war for practice. And if you look at it nowadays, you'll see little caves on the left-hand side, about two or three quarters up. That's where some of the shells hit and exploded."

Tony said the Japanese plane would have come from a ship located

The Japanese revealed after the war that they had picked Mapleton as a potential location for an airstrip, should they invade.

"Planes are most vulnerable when they're taking off, so being 1200 feet above sea level gives you somewhat of an advantage because you're already in the air. At the end of the day, nothing happened because of the Battle of the Coral Sea (May 4-8, 1942), and we can thank the Americans for saving Australia."





Where does our



Sunshine Coast residents pay a \$45 transport levy per year, per rateable property.

Our Estimated Resident Population (ERP) was 346,648, in 2021 with a density of 151.3 persons per square kilometre (ppkm2).

Noosa Shire residents pay \$30 per year, per rateable property, for their sustainable transport levy.

The Noosa Council ERP in 2021 was 56,873, with 65.22 ppkm2.

For that small outlay, Noosa Shire Council provides free bus services for their ratepayers, funded by their levy.

Selected buses are free during Christmas and Easter school holidays; including the popular 065 Go Noosa Loop Bus.

The 065 Go Noosa Loop Bus travels in a clockwise direction servicing Hastings Street, Noosa Drive, Weyba Road and Noosa Parade. The service operates approximately every 15 minutes from 7am - 7pm and every 30 minutes from 7pm - 10pm.

The 626, 627, 628, 629 and 632 bus routes are free on weekends.

Wouldn't it be great to have something like this on the Sunshine Coast, accessing our beaches and/or hinterland hot-spots?



Club spokesman Greg Williams said the players were outstanding and would do Australia proud.

Meanwhile, at the club junior level, coaching director Patrick Wuertz has inspired a raft of new juniors to join the club and they are already tasting success.


