Princess Di's carriage unearthed just in time for Big Pineapple's 50th birthday

train carriage ridden by Princess Diana and Prince Charles during a tour of Woombve's Big Pineapple has been found and restored just in time for the iconic destination's 50th birthday.

The carriage had been in storage for the past 20 years and was found with its original plaque to commemorate the royal visit in 1983.

Diablo Oasis owner Dimitris Limnatitis made the discovery when he went hunting for it after seeing it in a picture of the big day.

As part of the Big Pineapple's 50th birthday celebrations, the unearthed carriage will become a permanent feature at the Big Pineapple's Diablo Oasis bar.

The Big Pineapple opened in 1971 and was the biggest thing on the Sunshine Coast for many years.

At its peak in the 1980s, about a

million people would visit a year - enough to match the visitor numbers of Dreamworld on the Gold Coast even now.

But nothing was bigger than the royal couple's visit on April 12, 1983.

If you were around back then you may remember the crowds when Lady Diana and Prince Charles toured the region.

People lined the streets to catch a glimpse of the very popular princess.

The royal party attended a luncheon and also enjoyed a visit to Buderim Ginger and our very own Big Pineapple.

After going into receivership in 2009, The Big Pineapple site is currently undergoing renewal and transformation and features Wildlife HQ Zoo, TreeTop Challenge, Diablo Oasis bar, Cavu Distilling and more.

B2N 'useless' for Nambour

Beerburrum to Nambour (B2N) rail upgrade is chugging to a standstill before it even gets close to Nambour, according to a rail expert.

A joint media release from state and federal governments trumpeting the start of the long-awaited project has been mocked by Sunshine Coast Commuter Advocate and Gazette columnist Jeffrey Addison.

Works aimed at increasing capacity and easing congestion are expected to start early next year and be com-

The Australian Government will provide \$390 million and the Queensland Government \$160.8 million.

Queensland Transport and Main Roads Minister Mark Bailey said early works would provide a shot in the arm for local jobs on the Sunshine

Fisher MP Andrew Wallace said the early works was one of several projects planned to improve the freight and passenger connection between Brisbane and Cairns.

\$390 million commitment to rail upgrades between Beerburrum and Nambour was delivering the transport infrastructure the Sunshine Coast needed and deserved.

State Member for Nicklin Robert Skelton said the project would see park 'n' ride upgrades at Nambour and Landsborough stations.

"The early works will increase the park 'n' ride capacity at Landsborough and Nambour stations, helping to manage parking pressures in the surrounding streets and suburbs," Mr Skelton said.

"For people in my community, the upgrade to the Nambour Station park 'n' ride facility will provide about 50 new parking spaces, boosting Nambour's commuter car parking to more than 300 spaces."

"It's just useless"

But Mr Addison was less enthusiastic about the project considering the high expectations that have been hyped over the years.

bour gets 50 extra car parks, and not one extra train. So, I mean, what does that tell you? It's just useless," he said. "And those car parks in Nambour aren't needed until 2036 according to the business case. Building car parks with railroad money is just a bit of a furphy anyway.

They should be footing the money to actually duplicate the rail to at least reach Landsborough at the absolute

minimum, but they're not even doing that. And that's extraordinarily disappointing.

that's extraordinarily disappointing.

"My question to them would be, 'What's the point of providing more parking spaces if you haven't provided any more trains, or have no plans to provide us with any more trains?

"We were promised nine extra daily trains by Jackie Trad in 2015 — 4 southbound and 5 northbound. We got two since then.

"They were meant to remove the rail buses throughout the day. So that was, historically a lie, I guess, in retrospect."

Mr Addison said anyone expecting rail duplication to Nambour should not hold their breath despite Mr O'Brien's recent push for one.

"It's not even on the radar," he said. "At least it's not on the radar for the State Government. The bulk of the money is the Federal Government, so the bulk of our thanks goes to the Federal Government for funding it 70 percent. The state still only want to fund it 20 percent and then claim it's a priority.

"Ted O'Brien has pushed for that study into full rail duplication to Nambour. He put out the \$5 million, but it has to be on a matching basis — \$5 million from the state. But the state are only giving \$1.25 million towards that study, which means I don't think it'll go ahead, because they're not coming to the game for even just a study into the work. So that just shows you what they're commitment level is. It's not a commitment level."

New pathway could lead kids to danger, says resident

A new pathway linking residential areas to Nambour CBD was unintentionally compounding a dangerous situation at a busy intersection, according to a local resident.

Nambour's Jan Howting said a newly completed 1km stretch of elevated pathway alongside Nambour Connection Road was a great improvement. But she said it would have the unintended consequence of encouraging more children to an already-busy and dangerous intersection close to town.

"Council has done this lovely footpath which gets you down to the corner, but the corner is a death trap," she said. "It's like dodgem cars. It's not like you can stand on the corner and negotiate traffic because you'll get skittled!"

Ms Howting said she had seen children from Nambour Christian College struggle to get across the road safely. "If the cross-traffic between Park Road and Arundell Avenue doesn't get you the cars turning left or right off Lamington Terrace (and Currie Street) will," she said.

"I've seen school children from Nambour

Christian College and adults coming down and taking their lives into their own hands and I've tried to get across myself. It's not good.

"They spent six months and heaps of money, but the problem is they haven't installed a crossing at the endpoint.

"I'm told Council can't do it and it has to go to the Department of Transport and Main Roads. So goodness knows how long that will take. I've written to them and received confirmation that they received my email but I haven't heard back from them since November."


A spokesperson from Main Roads told *The Gazette* there were no recorded pedestrian crashes at this intersection in the past 5 years.

"Upgrading this intersection to include pedestrian crossing facilities would be particularly complex and attract significant costs due to the steep terrain, existing intersection geometry and nearby public utility services.

"Transport and Main Roads is undertaking detailed assessments of this location, which are due to be completed this financial year. Any identified improvements will be prioritised against competing needs across the state-controlled network.

"We receive many requests for intersection and pedestrian crossing infrastructure upgrades and funding is directed to areas of highest priority. We consider site-specific factors including recorded crash history using data from the Queensland Police Service, traffic and pedestrian volumes, road geometry and visibility."

Nambour shop showcases local disability talent

A brand new retail store selling items handcrafted by people with disabilities has opened in the heart of Nambour.

Cr David Law opened Wabi Sabi Creations, a Compass Institute Initiative located in C-Square, at an official launch yesterday (Tuesday, August 17) alongside Compass Institute Founder and CEO David Dangerfield.

Wabi Sabi Creations will soon offer opportunities for people with intellectual and/or physical disabilities attending Compass to undertake supported retail traineeships in the store.

"I am delighted to celebrate the opening of Wabi Sabi Creations here in the centre of Nambour," said Cr David Law.

"There are two key features with this new retail outlet coming to town. Firstly they are demonstrating their belief in Nambour and its strong future. And secondly, it makes perfect sense for Wabi Sabi Creations to choose Nambour because our town is known for its diverse community where everyone belongs."

Wabi Sabi Creations is one of many social enterprises founded by the Compass Institute, all of which aim to provide hands-on skills-based training and vocational pathways to people with disabilities, along with challenging community perceptions about what people with disabilities are really capable of.

"There is a hidden assumption in mainstream society that a person with a disability is a liability," said Mr Dangerfield. "And that as such, they are best supported by welfare-style solutions

"At Compass we start with the assumption that a person with a disability is an asset, and like all assets, is best supported by learning, development and vocational opportunities.

"The Compass social enterprise model opens up a world of opportunity for people with a disability to experience and be seen in valued roles - as shop assistants, as creative artists, as baristas and very importantly, as role models to younger children with disabilities who can begin to dream that they can be whatever and whoever they want to be."

Wabi Sabi Creations also adds to Compass' growing presence in Nambour. In May this year, Compass opened a new Learning and Development Campus just across the courtyard in C-Square its sixth Campus - focusing on structured learning, development and creative programs for people with intellectual disabilities.

Compass has also been successfully operating a social enterprise café on Nambour Connection Road, Connections Café, for over 5 years now. This enterprise has offered meaningful vocational opportunities for over 50 young people with disabilities over this time and is about to undergo a transformation to allow for even bigger opportunities in the near future.

"Compass has successfully transplanted into Nambour, a complete ecosystem that supports school leavers to access further learning, skillsbased training and genuine vocational experiences", said Mr Dangerfield.

"We encourage the young person to explore their abilities, to think big and to work hard to become their ideal self.

"We've been asked 'Why Nambour?', and the response is: Because we believe in Nambour as a community of people, who want the best for their sons and daughters whether they have a disability or not.

"When you believe in people and in communities, they invariably rise up to meet those expectations. Compass is proud to be a part of the redevelopment of this community."



IT took one person with vision and drive to add colour and character to Nambour through quality street art. In the process Street Art Nambour Chairperson Lorraine Taylor has created inspiring murals, built community pride and provided employment for artists.

Curie's discovery of the chemical elements Radium and Polonium is reasonably well known, but this stage play, written by US actor and playwright Alan Alda, portrays the intellectual, determined and passionate woman behind the history.

In the early 20th century, women were not recognised as scientists or considered for awards such as the Nobel Prize. To be a

joint recipient in 1903 for her work on radiation was a shake-up for the scientific world.

The play is set between 1898 and 1911 during the time between the two Nobel Prize awards, when Curie faced and overcame discrimination, ethnic bigotry, family tragedy and sexual

Alda found himself inspired by her courage, not only in her scientific discoveries in abject conditions, but in overcoming prejudice from both the scientific community and the public. Marie Curie was not only the first woman to win a Nobel prize, she was the first person and only woman in history to win two Nobel prizes in separate categories, Physics and Chemistry.

Actor Susie Bushnell is delighted to be portraying Marie Curie. "She was such an inspirational person," says Susie, "forging her way into history through her brilliant work in Physics and Chemistry.

Emotionally she is a wonderful challenge to play, and it is an honour to bring such a strong character to the stage."

Court to rule on proposed wedding venue in Montville

SIGNS have sprung up along Western Avenue Montville in protest at a hinterland retreat's application to host weddings.

Black and yellow protest signs adorn the length of the street with residents, particularly at the western end, worried about increased noise and traffic and the impact associated roadworks will have on their idyllic streetscape should the application be granted.

Sunshine Coast Regional Council has already green lit the application by Montville Country Cabins for the Material Change of Use to host weddings, capped at 45 guests.

But now it's up to a Judge to decide whether to uphold Council's decision. An appeal is being heard in Brisbane's Land and Environment Court this month (August 23 to 25).

Residents say Council's approval was based on flawed information and could see a dramatic increase in the number of weddings hosted at the venue. Nearby neighbour Claire Donoghue lodged the appeal citing serious material errors in the reports prepared by sound engineers.

"The approval presents some serious concerns for neighbours relating to noise and traffic and the impact it will have on our lifestyle," Ms Donoghue said. "We do wonder how an application can be approved that was going to have significant impact on a community.

"Initially there had only been a few (weddings) a year which locals had put up with despite the sound impact. However in recent years the number of events had increased dramatically and subsequently they were reported to council. And now we find council has approved up to 52 a year, which is untenable to locals."

Montville Country Cabins' owners said neighbourhood anxiety was based on incorrect information. They say they have hosted weddings on the property for 11 years without a single complaint, had the support of many residents and took their role as good neighbourhood citizens very seriously.

Zonta birthing kits help to save mums' and babies' lives

ON Saturday August 28 members of the Zonta Club of Blackall Range will be gathering at the Uniting Church in Maleny to spend the morning packing birthing kits.

Why do these volunteers spend their time doing this? Because The World Health Organisation estimates that 830 women (and their babies) die every day, most of them in developing countries from infections acquired during childbirth.

"Zonta's aim is to empower women through service and advocacy and this is a tangible way of making that happen," said June Robson from Zonta.

The kit is a simple package that includes a 1m square piece of plastic, rubber gloves, a sterile blade, gauze and cord ties, and soap. The kits help expectant mothers in third world countries have a birth that is, at least, hygienic.

"To know that, at a local level, you're folding up pieces of plastic, and putting together kits that help create a sterile environment for childbirth, is good. This is something in western

society we just take for granted," Ms Robson from Zonta said.

To date, 2.4 million Clean Birth Kits have been distributed to women in need. So, the Zonta Club of Blackall Range will be busy packing the 600 kits they have purchased.

"We want to help to move towards a world in which all women and girls have access to a clean and safe birth," said Ms Robson.

Detectives from the Maroochydore Criminal Investigation Branch have commenced an investigation and a crime scene has been established.


Two people were yesterday assisting police with their inquiries. Police said the 32-year-old man was allegedly stabbed to death in Nambour overnight as detectives comb the area.





SUNSHINE Coast residents have been given an extra week to pay their rate bill in a move to help residents affected by the recent Queensland COVID lockdown.

Sunshine Coast Council Finance Portfolio Councillor Ted Hungerford said residents now had until 27 August to pay their rate bills without incurring interest.

Register for a MyCouncil account or login to an existing account, change your rate notice delivery method to email before 25 August and you'll be in the running.





Australia's digital divide widens

THE New Daily (11/08/2021) reported that the Federal government has promised to upgrade, at no cost to the householder, thousands of under-performing NBN connections to full fibre this year, with up to two million upgrades planned by the end of 2023.

The free upgrades for internet users currently unable to access higher speeds were first announced by Communications Minister Paul Fletcher last year.

The problem for Sunshine Coast Hinterland internet users is that everyone with notoriously poor Fixed Wireless or Satellite NBN connections will miss out on this upgrade. Even more galling is the fact that hundreds of Hinterland households and businesses that can't get an NBN internet connection (and languish using 25 year old ADSL technology with connection speed of 10Mbps), have to watch helplessly while city households and businesses are upgraded free of charge, to speeds of 100Mbps to 500Mbps.

Australia has a proud history of being an egalitarian nation. The NBN rollout appears to favour residents of Australia's Central Business Districts. It is essential that the Federal government correct this inequitable situation before its too late.

Rail duplication to Nambour won't happen

SEEMS lately that every few weeks rail duplication to Nambour raises its head and the same old arguments are stated (SVG, 21 July).

Firstly Governments will only build passenger railways to population centres. The purpose is to connect the population centres with major cities and to have a local transportation network.

In our case this would be the CAMCOS route connecting the Coast population centres with

the main QR line at Beerwah, thereby offering the Coast a connection to Brisbane.

In addition the line would provide a local rail network between Beerwah and Maroochydore maybe every 10 or 15 minutes and have local bus services connecting with trains at the Coast stations.

No Government is going to spend billions of dollars – yes billions – duplicating the rail line through to Nambour. Nambour and the railway towns simply do not have the population to warrant such investment. Plus Coast residents simply will not drive to Nambour or the railway towns to catch the train to Brisbane.

So common sense says let us ... everyone including politicians ... get behind the CAMCOS line and for goodness sake start construction!

No more feasibility studies ... we've already had too many of those.

On the subject of fast rail: forget it on the current tracks. QR tracks are 3' 6" gauge which, in railway terms, is narrow gauge. With these tracks you cannot operate Fast Rail.

Globally Fast Rail operates on standard gauge dedicated tracks — 4' 8 ½" (1435mm). And everything you need in technology and rolling stock for this gauge is already in existence.



I lived in South Africa for many years before arriving in Australia. In that country they would paint a spot, about the size of a small dinner plate on the roadway, halfway along the outline of a parking bay.

The spot was a guide to anyone parking. It enabled you to know where the mid-point of the bay was just by looking out the driver's window. Pretty much every driver has some idea about where the middle of their car is. So there were few, if any, occasions of cars parked so badly that an adjacent bay was made unusable.

I wrote to Sunshine Coast Council, RACO and to the Transport Department about this and the latter sent me a link to some very complex forms to fill out and submit for consideration. They required all manner of information that I, as a private individual, have no idea about. It was a suggestion that I would have thought could be put up for discussion. But pretty much everyone who bothered to respond, including the RACQ, was dismissive.

Comments ranged from "No one will know what they are for" to "people know how to park" (questionable when I look around) to "we have not noticed a need for any intervention".

They were dismissive and giving the impression that it might mean some work and that the various people were just not interested. I thought the first comment was an insult to all drivers common sense and the second to be evasive if not downright ignorant. Why would I bother to comment if everyone parked perfectly?

It seems such a simple suggestion based on observation of a practice that works. I would have thought the authorities might at least be







Spotted in Nambour!


In a rare sighting, council officers recently came across a baby platypus in Nambour. Isn't this a great testament to the health of the waterways and rivers in our great town. Did you know Quota Park and Moreton Mill Weirs are two of the top 20 most significant fish barriers on the Sunshine Coast? This is due to their large size, their proximity to the estuary and good upstream habitat value of the creek. Fish and fauna surveys were conducted by council in March and April 2020. The fish survey found 17 species of fish within Petrie Creek, five species were strictly migratory fish species, including two species of mullet, Australian bass, long-finned eel, and empire gudgeon.

Bus network updates = good news

Since Monday 2 August 2021, changes have been made to Sunshine Coast bus timetables.

These services are provided by the Department of Transport and Main Roads, via TransLink and are operated by Sunbus.

The updated timetables apply to 22 bus routes in our region.

These are bus numbers; 600, 602, 603, 605, 606, 607, 610, 611, 612, 614, 615, 616, 617, 618, 619, 620, 622, 628, 629, 631, 636 and 637.

The arrival and/or departure times may vary by around 5 minutes depending upon whether it is school holidays or during school semes-

This will be easier for those who have children in school - but for me will be slightly more challenging given my offspring have now left school.

The changes are enabled by the 'My TransLink' smartphone app and the Journey Planner on TransLink's website that allows variances to occur and be communicated in near real-time against what used to be paperprinted (and thus change-rigid) timetables.

TransLink are to be commended for this new approach.

Any commuter knows that during school holidays there is far less traffic on the roads and journeys tend to be quicker as a result.

The changes to the bus timetables take this into consideration.

My bus would usually be pretty well on-time during school holidays and late by anything up to 10 minutes during school semesters.

It improves the accuracy of the timetable and that is a good thing.

As a heads up, next school holidays run from Monday 20 September to Friday 1 October

Check the website or the app for changes to bus departure times.

By way of some interesting history, Sunbus was established in 1995.

It has been the subject of take-overs, acquisitions and consolidations.

Sunbus was awarded rights to operate bus services in the Cairns, Ipswich, Rockhampton, Sunshine Coast and Townsville regions.

They ran school bus operations as a result of operators they acquired but sold those routes to UK based company Stagecoach in 1997, who, by way of interest - and I totally digress, lost an £11 million tax avoidance scheme in a UK court

Anyway, in April 2008, Sunbus was sold to Transit Australia Group (TAG).

In 2016, TAG formed an alliance with Precision Components in Adelaide to develop an advanced manufacturing facility to produce environmentally friendly diesel and electric

In April 2019, TAG was purchased by the AATS Group who also owned SkyBus.

SkyBus operate airport bus services in Melbourne, Hobart, Brisbane and Auckland.


AATS Group now operated Sunbus (Cairns, Magnetic Island, Rockhampton, Sunshine Coast and Townsville), Surfside Buslines on the Gold Coast, Skybus and others.

In August 2019, AATS Group rebranded as

Kinetic Group are Australia and New Zealand's biggest bus operator with 3000 buses and over 4000 employees.

They carry over 50 million passengers. They are majority owned by Canadian pension fund OPTrust.


