Reimagine Nambour Facilitator:

Trams and live music are the keys to reactivating Nambour CBD

THE Nambour Heritage Tramway project and live music venues were the keys to reinvigorating the former sugar town's CBD, according to Reimagine Nambour facilitator Kerry Brown.

Ms Brown said the Tramway project and Special Entertainment Precinct zoning would give Nambour CBD exciting points of difference, and encourage locals and tourists in to town by day and night.

Ms Brown said there was a growing sense Nambour was on the cusp of a prosperous new era and she longed to see it live up to its full potential.

"I grew up in Nambour when it was the centre of the Universe," Ms Brown said. "It was the golden mile. But times change and people, and even towns, have to adapt. And there's no doubt that Nambour will adapt because it has so much heart and soul. The people are wonderful. The will is there. And all it needs is

a spark.
"Nambour lends itself naturally to being a Special Entertainment Precinct because we don't have houses in the CBD, so there's no noise concerns," Ms Brown said.

"It's about making the town vibrant again - live performances, restaurants, night life, tappas bars - so people can come and enjoy the CBD and activate that night-time space."


Ms Brown said two live music venues were in progress, one where Dimmeys used to be and one in the Bi-Rite building.

"We're just waiting on Council," she said. "They're holding a stake-holders meeting in early February, to basically work with these venues and make it happen for them. The people involved live locally and have great experience in the industry. But it's hard for them because they're paying rent, and doing up these buildings and going to a lot of expense while

"Cr David Law has been very, very supportive of it. But really now the wait is on Council and we're keen to see how quickly they're going to pro-

The tram will run from the Tram Terminus in Mill Street, adjacent to the Nambour Mill Village Shopping Centre, to the southern end of Quota Park (between Repco and Aldi), and is expected to be operational this year.

Ms Brown said Reimagine Nambour, Nambour Chamber of Com-

Humble Maleny OAM recipient surprised by attention

WHEN Maleny volunteer Norma McLeod saw an email from the Official Secretary to the Governor General in her inbox she thought she was the victim of a practical joke.

"I thought someone was having a go at me," Norma said. But it wasn't a hoax. It was an email informing Norma she was being recognised in the Australia Day 2021 Honours list for her contribution to the Maleny community.

Norma was one of only five Sunshine Coast recipients of an Order of Australia Medal (OAM). The medal is acknowledgement of her work for Centre for Retirement Living (Blue Care), Maleny Show Society, Maleny Garden Club, Maleny Floral Art Group and the Maleny Soldiers Memorial Hospital, to name a few.

Norma, who turns 85 on February 11, said receiving an award was the last thing she expected.

"You don't do all this work for the rewards," she said. "It's just for the enjoyment of the work — the camaraderie and the people. I like volunteering. I like the people I volunteer with. It's very interesting and it's very rewarding."

Norma said a chance meeting with a well known "Maleny Matriarch" when she was new to town was the catalyst for the quarter century of

"Peg Burnett got me started," she said. "We were on a bus trip with the Garden Club 25 years ago and coming back up the Range. I'd been chatting with Peg and eventually she jokingly said: 'You can stay here in Maleny, and I don't say that to everyone I meet'." Norma later realised it was a worthy endorsement from a lady who was at the time the "unofficial mayor of Maleny'

"Later (husband) Keith and I saw Peg in town and she said 'You're

Maleny's Montana Park equestrian property sells

THE Maleny property known as Montana Park, one of the country's finest equestrian properties, has been sold.

Former luxury car dealer Greg Willims took ownership of the 42ha Mountain View Road property for \$6.1 million. It was previously owned by former Neds managing director and ex-Ladbrokes CEO Dean Shannon.

The property has 12 bedrooms, 11 bathrooms two Olympic dressage arenas and a resort-style pool among its features.

Tragedy at Gardners Falls

A 40-year-old Nepalese man from Caloundra drowned on Australia Day when he disappeared after jumping off rocks at Gardner Falls. Rescue crews were called to the natural

waterhole in Obi Lane, Maleny, just before 5pm. They were acting on reports the man went missing for more than 10 minutes. Police divers located the man's body about 8pm.

The tragedy follows that of a 15-year-old boy who died at Gardners Falls in 2019 after being pulled unconscious from the water. Signage at the Falls, managed by Council, warns people of submerged rocks and not to dive.

Servo proposal likely to fire up locals

A development application for a service station in Yandina is likely to receive opposition from locals, according to a business owner.

Yandina Hardware owner Gab Pawson, who railed hard against a proposed Bunnings Harware some years ago, said residents were surprised by the news since the town already had a service station, within throwing distance of the proposed site at 8 Stevens St and 15 Farrell St.

Mrs Pawson said the application by Pearl Investment (Aust) Pty Ltd - Innovative Planning Solutions had caused a stir in town. "It seems dangerous from a traffic point of

view. It would be right next to a childcare. And two servos so close in a tiny town is ridiculous,'

"Personally I think it would be a disaster for the town. Bad for cafes, coffee shops and the bakery etc. The congestion is going to be atrocious. And that street floods. There was no room for a roundabout. How the heck do they think they will get tankers in? We heard about the servo application about 12 months ago but it looks like it's actually starting to click through."

Crs to voice residents' views as new town plan takes shape

few years developing a new planning scheme to shape land use and development across the

Planning schemes describe council's plan for managing growth, change and the aspirations of a local community.

Div 5 Cr Winston Johnston said hinterland residents wanted wider streets with parking, less dual occupancy lots in low density residential subdivisions, average lot sizes which enable retention of country town lifestyles and a greater protection of green space and existing vegetation covers.

"I'll be pushing for all that as well as ensuring that the current and future rapid growth of the Coast does not intrude into the hinterland."

Div 10 Cr David Law said residents wanted good logical development that respected the environment and the unique identity of hinter-

"During my first nine months, in meetings and conversations, I learned people were looking to preserve habitat and green spaces. They want development that includes trees and green coverage. They want new housing devel-



opments that do not overcrowd the space. And they want better control around duplex and dual occupancy on a single lot. And in nearly every discussion I had people raised the urgent need for infrastructure to keep pace with devel-

Cr Law said he would be pushing for excellent community engagement.

"I know Nambour really well so I need to be sure that the community members who know their towns really well participate in the contain their unique character. And we need more than just my point of view for Nambour. The more community participation the better, and I encourage everyone to get involved."

When new housing developments occur, Cr

Law said he would be seeking better connectivity for footpaths through to the central areas of each community. "To encourage people to get out of our vehicles and walk or cycle," he said.

Sunshine Coast Council Mayor Mark Jamieson said the current scheme had been in place since 2014. "A lot can change in 10 years, but one thing

that remains constant is the importance of maintaining our region's identity, character and lifestyle," Mayor Jamieson said.

"We cannot escape the fact that people move to the Coast to enjoy our laid-back lifestyle, community spirit and of course, our spectacular beaches and hinterland."

Council's next step in the process is to undertake necessary background planning work before starting the extensive formal planmaking process which typically takes several

State plays straight bat to residents' Rail A/C noise queries

THE Gazette put three questions to Queensland Rail's Community Engagement team about noise from Woombye Stabling Facility.

The questions and response from Translink,

Questions:

Given it's been a year since residents near the Woombye Stabling Facility have complained of noise from trains' air-conditioning units running at full power because of design flaws:

· Can QR provide a time frame for when trains will be stored at the facility in the quieter sta-• When will the mould and mildew problem

be fixed? • Is a solution imminent or is this going to be

an ongoing issue?

Answer:

A Transport and Main Roads (TMR) spokesperson gave the following response yesterday. "The upgrade to air-conditioning systems across the NGR fleet to address humidity is hap-

"The reintroduction of the (quieter) stabling

mode in the NGR fleet is scheduled for completion by mid-2021. "A noise monitoring survey was conducted

by an independent consultant between 24 September to 14 October 2020, and again, between 4 to 10 August 2020. the initial report, confirming the outdoor noise

environment is primarily influenced by residential activity, local road traffic, natural sources such as birdsong, breeze blown vegetation and trains passing by on the North Coast Line.

"Based on these findings, TMR believes that noise from stowed passenger trains (including the train air conditioning systems) is not the source of excessive noise.

"Queensland Rail provided the second Woombye Stabling Yard noise monitoring report to residents on 14 December 2020."

Worm juice's reputation is quickly growing

ITH a herd of six million, Scott Robinson is not your typical hinterland farmer. He does what it takes to keep his livestock happy. He feeds them grain and protein, beds them down at night and makes sure conditions are just right for maximum production from the Glenview property.

But Scott is a worm farmer. "I gave up 400 garden beds and watch them grow. nead of cattle in another life, for six million worms," Scott joked. "Now I breed reds, tigers, blues and night crawlers!"

With an output of six tonnes of castings (worm poo) and 60,000 litres of juice, or worm 'tea', annually, Scott's Polyculture Worm Farm products are sought after by farmers and gardeners from miles around. The proven superfood is renowned for enriching soil and promoting healthy plant growth.

Scott says his methods and ingredients make his worm juice a cut above the rest.

"The secret is that we don't just feed the worms, we feed the microbes in the juice that the worms produce," he said. "We feed the worms in the bedding and we also feed the microbes in the juice. And because we go that extra step our tea is very different to what people might produce at home."

Scott said most worm tea has about 10 million microbes per millilitre (yes millilitre) where his contains about 20 million. "Usually worm juice is light brown. As you can see mine is really dark. It's very nutritious."

Worm castings are the most complete fertilizer readily available to plants. "Plants can absorb those nutrients immediately," said Scott. "It's just superfood - loaded with millions of microbes and all the trace elements in balance that plants need to grow strong and healthy. Put a handful in with new plants or add it to your







With the ongoing storms that may cause damage to your home or even if you are carrying out home renovations, it's crucial to remember asbestos removal and disturbance can be extremely hazardous.



Unspinning State's Railway 'lines'

THIS is Part 2 of an article which began last edition. Below is a time line of break ups & downs of our weekly 'services' over the past decade. 11 July 2011 we had 349 services, comprising

219 trains & 130 rail-buses. 20 January 2014 saw an increase to 359 services, the LNP granting us two extra trains/ weekday making 229 trains & 130 rail-buses. This day, 7 years ago marked the zenith of our

services. 30 September 2016 saw the first wave of mass train cancellations (#RailFail) & its fallout impacted trains for almost 3 years.

The 4 October 2016 timetable saw an 11% cut to Sunshine Coast services, reduced to 320/ week, being 245 trains (a 16 train increase) & 75 rail-buses (a 55 bus decrease) making a weekly 'service' net loss of 39. On the bright side, and as a trade-off, we got six more daily expresses and more consistent express legs.

23 January 2017 saw our services remain static at 320, QR thankfully recognising our impoverished numbers.

However, Wednesday 28 December 2017 to 22 January 2018 saw further big (short-term) cuts in what we euphemistically called: the Summer Holiday Interim Timetable - the traindriver depleted Rail-Fail left us bereft with 235 services, a savage 27% cut from the 320.

The 2018 (30 March - 20 April) Commonwealth Games/Easter temporary timetable saw more rail carnage (excuse the pun).

228 trains & no rail-buses was our nadir. This made it a record 36.5% service cut since the zenith of 2014. Not many could catch the train to the Games from the Sunshine Coast; it was no-rail-way or the highway.

Numbers returned to 320 per week after the

3 December 2018 saw the dawn of a new metric ... seats. 46,000 were added to the SEQ network (the Govt liked to proclaim this new metric because it sounded like much more). Thus 193 carriages were upgraded from 3 car sets to 6 car NGR sets. Clever, hey? Of those 46,000 - we got none.

On 13 May 2019, SEQ got 32 new trains - or 14,000 seats. Of those 14,000 – we got none.

In the 29 July 2019 timetable iteration some of our express leg journeys became 6 minutes longer. 430 trains were added, 10 trains were upgraded from 3 car sets to 6 car (NGR) sets making 200,000 extra seats. Of those 200,000 we got none.

Finally, with the dawn of 2 March 2020 our time to shine arrived. 260,000 seats later, 32 weekly trains were added across SEQ, but the new seat metric had vanished.

Of the 32 trains - we got one ... The 5:38am from Nambour to Roma St.

Today we've 325 services comprising 250 trains & 75 rail-buses. The down-shot of the statistics; on 11 July

2011 we had 349 services per week. As of 2 March 2020 we've 325 services per



Intrastate travel drives hinterland tourism

THE Sunshine Coast expanded its intrastate market to reduce disruption from COVID-19.

According to the latest National Visitor Survey 837,000 intrastate visitors travelled to the Sunshine Coast in the September quarter, compared to 599,000 for the corresponding

Visit Sunshine Coast CEO, Matt Stoeckel said overall visitor numbers were down, but the Sunshine Coast recorded the lowest decrease of all Queensland regions, declining -3.7% to 886,000

Mr Stoeckel said the National Visitor Survey figures highlighted the impact of Covid-19 on tourism, but targeting the intrastate market had insulated the region from the worst.


