Maleny hills are alive with parkrunners

NOW you may think running up and down hills is not your idea of fun. But looking at the grinning faces at the start line of the Maleny Trail parkrun you will begin to ask yourself if you can have what they're having.

An international phenomenon, "parkruns" are free, timed, weekly 5km runs that enhance communities across the globe. You can run, jog or walk. The ethos is simple: to make the world a healthier, happier place.

"And it certainly does that," said Maleny Trail parkrun event director Ioanne Turner.

"Maleny is one of the newest members of the parkrun family on the Sunshine Coast, and when we say family, we mean it. The run is like an umbrella that instantly connects people."

Around the world parkrunners meet every Saturday, rain, hail or shine. "It's a fantastic way to see new places ... lace up your runners and find the nearest parkrun. You get to meet the locals and gain an insider's view of a place. The parkrun family really look after each other, even if you've never met."

Maleny Trail parkrun might not be flat, but it is certainly one of the

Affordable hinterland lifestyle attracts COVID-weary city dwellers Tree change trend continues

A perfect storm is brewing for the hinterland property market as cashed up buyers continue to escape to the country from interstate, overseas and within Queensland.

House prices in regional areas have risen faster than in capital cities for the first time since 2004, as COVID-19 increases people's desire for space.

Corelogic recently calculated that

over the past financial year, 25,350 residents relocated from other Australian states to settle in Queensland. This influx, as well as the return of expats from overseas, has increased demand in the hinterland.

Maleny

Rodney Millett of Maleny & Hinterland Real Estate said the market was buoyant with the increase in demand from other states. "But it's further influenced by the intra-state influx from residents relocating from the greater Brisbane and wider Queensland regions to the Sunshine Coast," he said.

"This, coupled with the slower supply of available properties for sale, has certainly supported the firming of prices across the Hinterland.

"Investors are also returning to the property market, looking for opportunities to secure stronger returns with property investment versus other investment avenues. These positive factors are all contributing to a stronger market. But one that is still underpinned by some overall national influence of uncertainty moving forward."

Palmwoods

Palmwoods agent Mike Burns said southerners and expats were driving sales in the hinterland.

"The market is still incredible with huge influx of expats returning to

Nambour parkrun the Nation's toughest, if course set to Plan B

WHILE Maleny Trail parkrun may be the newcomer, Nambour has its own much-loved weekly event.

Nambour parkrun is a beautiful 5km course through the natural bush in the Parklands conservation park.

Along with the newly formed Maleny Trail parkrun, the Nambour version is part of the worldwide phenomenon of free, timed, weekly 5km runs that you are welcome to walk, jog, run or race with others every Saturday at 7am.

"It's a beautiful run and, with our course having about 180 metres of elevation, we were considered the toughest parkrun in Queensland," said Event Director Melisa Taylor.

"Although an event in Western Australia appears to have stolen the 'toughest in Australia' title from us, unless we are using our Plan B course which has 200 metres elevation.

Melisa said numbers were solid but small compared to other events on the Coast as Nambour's trails and hills were not everyone's cup of tea.

"But we do have a very friendly welcoming bunch of regular park runners and volunteers, she said.

"The event belongs to the community and we rely on everyone to volunteer at least three times a year to keep it running smoothly.

"And we do have a lot of people that volunteer more, as well as volunteers who don't run but participate just to be part of our community!"

This week runners achieved their 50th, 100th and 150th runs.

One person has completed 200 runs and is the

first person over 80 to ever do so in the world. · For more info see the website www.parkrun.

Australia, looking for lifestyle and the Sunshine Coast hinterland is a most desirable location," he said. "In terms of rentals we had 60 applications on a Woombye property. The tenant paid six months up front and well above asking price. It's very hard for tenants to secure a home.

"In terms of sales we're getting multiple offers on all listings and great results for our sellers. But a problem for a few of our sellers is that they want to down-size and move but if I put their home on the market it will sell and leave them homeless. I am currently trying to find a new home for them before we go to market."

Nambour

Nambour agent Peter Wrigley of Carolans First National said the market was moving at a rapid pace. "The conditions of the market are such that there is a only small amount of stock available but great demand for stock," he said. "This is driving up prices. Added to this is the fact that interest rates are so low.

"Given these circumstances, sellers should sell and buy in the same market. Tenants should also seriously be talking to their mortgage broker to see if they can buy in this market. Otherwise, with so many owner-occupiers joining the market, the supply of rental properties is also dwindling. If you can't beat them you are going to have to join them I'm afraid."

Blackall Range

Mapleton agent Roger Loughnan said regional house prices were seeing significant increases for the first time in 15 years.

"We have always said that the Hinterland was a very stable market with an annual growth rate of approximately three percent," he said. "Every now and then we do have a catch-up, such as now, where sales are being achieved well above previous levels.

"The last quarter or 2020 has been particularly strong with most of our sales meeting and exceeding the asking price. We believe the combination of a surplus of dollars from the ban on overseas travel, low interest rates and people being able to access their super to boost their deposits has helped fuel this boom.

"Buyers have ranged from Coast residents seeking a quieter environment or a weekender, to ex-pats wanting to secure property back in Australia and certainly a number of buyers from New South Wales and Victoria.

"Listings are now the biggest issue, with current residents not wanting to sell because they don't know where to go. Any locals considering a move, now is the time to make good gains."


When asked if he had any grandchildren to share the toys in the prize, John said he didn't, but he knew of kids who would be given the toys.

Relief for operators as tourists seek solace in the hinterland

EVERY dark cloud has a silver lining as they say. And that appears to be the case for many hinterland tourist operators as COVID-weary city slickers flock to the area in numbers.

Bans on overseas travel has also meant families and retirees have swapped holidays abroad for destinations closer to home. The hinterland offers a perfect alternative and the influx is helping operators make up for three months of shutdowns last year.

Owners of Mapleton's Eden Lodge Bed & Breakfast, Julie and Charlie Bevan, say they have broken booking records for seven of the past eight months since restrictions were eased.

"Since COVID lockdown, when we closed for three months, we have actually had our largest occupancy rates in seven years," said Julie. "Today is our first morning without guests for 18 davs."

"When the lockdown occurred last weekend (January 9-10) we had two cancellations. But we were lucky and within minutes all rooms were booked online with one couple who had flown in to Brisbane for the weekend from Rockhampton. They were advised on the plane about the lockdown so they hired a car and came straight up here. Another couple who were due to stay a few nights in Brisbane came up here instead and then a third couple gave Brisbane a wide berth on their way up from Victoria and stayed with us for 3 nights.'

Despite lockdowns B&B life remains enjoyable and rewarding

Julie and Charlie have reluctantly had Eden Lodge on the market and said they would definitely miss the friendly and flexible B&B lifestyle.

"I don't know how to put into words the joys of running a B&B," said Julie.

"Meeting so many different people. Talking and laughing over breakfast. Not a mobile device in sight.

"I have had a lot of jobs in my lifetime and I can tell you this has to be the most rewarding of all positions I have held.'

There is a perception that it's hard work but if it is such hard work, how do they think a couple in their sixties can even manage it and keep smiling," she laughed.


Despite COVID challenges that saw most Christmas events cancelled, the Montville Chamber organised its first Festive Street Fair and the photography competition.

Helping wildlife often takes an emotional toll

SOMETIMES a call will come through the WILVOS 5441 6200 Hotline that has quite an emotional impact. After dealing with so many wildlife tragedies, carers and rescuers are ready to expect the worst when attending to an injured animal on the side of the road.

Recently a couple of our carers responded to a call for a possum hit on the road running beside the Steggalls Road development in Yandina. Both said it was one of the saddest calls they'd ever attended. The beautiful big majestic short-eared brushtail, weighing around four kilograms, had died from her injuries and just a couple of metres away her backriding joey of almost a kilogram was also dead. These possums, formerly known as mountain brushtails or bobucks are one of our largest possums and are such muscly, healthy animals that look indestructible. They are also the most loving and trusting of all the possum species. The joeys are so gentle and often cry for their mothers for the first couple of days in care.

What a sad waste of two lovely animals.

These are just two of the many native animals now being hit by cars along Old Gympie Road and Steggalls Road. Scores of houses have replaced the once beautiful bushy hectares of habitat.

What happens next? An occasional resident will complain about possums in their roof or in their yard, inconveniencing them by making their dogs bark. These poor animals are searching for a new home after being displaced. I don't think the few token nesting boxes put up will solve the problem.

Please drive carefully, take home any plastic bags, pick up that fishing line and cut it into small pieces before disposing of it. Small things can make a big difference.

Second Red Bench to raise **DV** awareness

RECENTLY a second Red Bench was launched in Maleny as part of a local campaign to stop domestic violence.

The first is outside the post office. The bench was donated to Maleny shoppers years ago by local service club Quota. It was their last project in the town. They facilitated its renovation by the Men's Shed and Rotary, and included the Red Bench plaque "Domestic Violence: Let's change the ending".

Then, on a rainy day before Christmas, Federal member for Fisher Andrew Wallace and Cr Winston Johnston pulled the white ribbon at the Maleny Neighbourhood Centre; and the second Red Bench was ready for tired citizens.

In his speech Andrew Wallace expressed his horror at the statistics revealed by the Federal Government's Standing Committee for Social Policy and Legal Affairs that will release its report on A Domestic and Family Violence Inquiry in February or March this year.

"This [report] is revealing harrowing information. One woman every nine days is killed as a result of DFV; each day 12 women are hospitalised from assault.

"...it certainly reaches every single corner of the country and doesn't discriminate by postcode, wealth or occupation. It permeates every single part of the community," he said.

Mr Wallace said men had to take a leading role in overcoming the scourge that starts with a lack of respect for partners and ex-partners.

"We need to look at men's behaviour programs. The inquiry is looking at 'coercive control', which is one of the pre-emptors of homicide. Coercive control means controlling the woman's finances, who she can and cannot see,

separating her from her family ...

"Nowadays this control is often done through mobile phones to have more control about a partner's movements.

"I have learnt a lot in the past six months from this inquiry. And thanks to MNC, Rotary and Zonta – the best thing we can do is talk about DV. Ask 'are you OK?" And if they are not okay, refer them to the appropriate help," he said.

Red Bench Project extended

As an added bonus for the SPEAK UP NOW committee, Cr Winston Johnston has advised that Sunshine Coast Council will coordinate the launch of the Red Bench Project across Council areas at Nambour, Alexandra Headlands, Caloundra and a third one for Maleny as part of DFV Prevention month in May.

The Red Bench Project is an initiative of the Red Rose Foundation, a National not for profit charity that works to end domestic and family violence across our communities.

It was launched in May 2019 as a permanent reminder that DFV occurs within all of our communities. The benches raise awareness and provide an opportunity for this issue to remain visible.

This year the SPEAK UP NOW committee will look at ways to get its message across to young people, says Rotary representative on the committee Greg Williams.

"I agree with Andrew Wallace that in order to 'change the culture we have to start with the kids'. So I am keen to partner with sporting, drama and church groups to look into innovative ways of engaging with them in seminars, fun events like a kite flying competition at a festival and drama activities," he said.

The current committee consists of members of the former Maleny Quota, Val France and Barbara Jones, Zontians Ann Koenig and Linda McElrea and representatives of Maleny Rotary Sherryl Gregory and Greg Williams.

Nambour Connection Road pathway

In great news for Division 10, construction is nearing completion of the new Nambour Connection Road pathway.

It runs from the Coles Express (Shell Panorama) to Magnolia Street, Nambour near the Hilton Terrace Apartments.

I'm pleased to also share council is taking the initiative to work with local street artists to produce an attractive and appropriate decoration of the concrete barrier. Street art will be applied to both sides of the barrier and will provide a stylish entry to Nambour.

The pathway is approximately 950m long and varies in width between 1.8m and 2.5m. There are three sections of cantilevered walkway required by the steep slopes at the side of the road. A combination of concrete barrier and guardrail will be in place to protect pedestrians using the pathway. In an added bonus, the pathway will have lighting along its entire length.

The project completes a missing pathway link and improves safety on the route between Nambour Christian College, the Nambour town centre and residential areas. It provides connectivity between residential populations from western suburbs of Nambour and the Nambour town centre, schools, sports facilities and employment precinct.

Construction is scheduled to be completed 16 February 2021, weather permitting.

Train services trail growth by 21%

We occasionally hear the state Government say how good the Sunshine Coast has it with a \$551 million rail extension to start soon. The heavy rail works are set to begin mid-2022. Of course, having extra duplicated track is only as good as the extra services it may enable.

I examined our train and rail-bus services over the past decade from 11 July 2011 to the last improvement on 2 March 2020.

The results, when compared to our population growth are extremely concerning.

The statistics reveal that the Sunshine Coast has been depleted of rail 'services' by over 21% when compared with growth.

In 2011, the census revealed our Sunshine Coast population to be 306,909.

In 2021, the estimated population (from Sunshine Coast Council website) is predicted to be 351,424, a 14.5% increase.

There's a reason I say 'services' and not trains. Many don't realise that almost a quarter of Sunshine Coast trains are literally 'rail-buses' (the 649) ... 23.1% to be precise.

They drive in and out of each station between Nambour and Caboolture and vice versa, every week day, 75/week in lieu of a real train. All due to the constricted single track shared between commuter trains, freight trains and long-distance (Cairns) trains.

It is why I campaign for full rail duplication to Nambour.

In 2011, rail-buses comprised 44% of weekday services. Journalists would laugh when I told them the figures, as they thought them too fanciful to be real. Buses replacing trains they'd ask? – and then I'd show them the timetable replete with rail-buses.

The rail-bus takes around 1 and ½ hours to go the 54km to/from Caboolture. It's sometimes quicker to wait for the next train.

2011 was a good year for commuters; we got two new trains after massive crowding as a result of the June 2011 timetable. The authorities had been warned that crowding would occur but decided to ignore our complaints. After the first night of aggregation aggravation on 6 June 2011, I wrote to then Transport Minister Annastacia Palaszczuk, took photographs of the compressed mayhem, sent them to her and asked that she come to platform 6 at Central and see it for herself. The very next night as I was waiting to squeeze onto my train, I got a tap on the shoulder and to her credit the Minister (now Premier) did come and see for herself. I recall seeing her eyes widen in disbelief as we packed in. It was enough!

Four weeks later - on 11 July 2011 we had a new train, the 5:24pm from Roma St to Nambour. It was neatly full from day one.

An existing train, the 5:02pm from Roma St to Caboolture, was extended up to Nambour.

The new train was a \$3 million fix, Chief Operations Officer of Queensland Rail, Mr Kevin Wright PSM (Ret'd) told me at the time.


