A huge splash of colour has arrived in Yandina with close to a thousand brightly coloured umbrellas suspended over the rainforest gardens at the Ginger Factory.

The team, inspired by Tourism Manager Brenda Bailey, collaborated with local artist Sophy Blake to create a joyous explosion of colour, aptly named the Rainbrella Project.

"The Ginger Factory is a place where people can come and enjoy art for art's sake," said Ginger Factory Tourism Manager Brenda

Bailey. "We are a free entry park and this is a public art installation that anybody can come and enjoy. And that, I love.

"It is our hope that being the first artwork of its kind on the Sunshine Coast, the installation brings joy, happiness and peace to all who journey through its colourful paths."

"The artwork explores the theme of hope and new beginnings," said artist Sophy Blake referring to the Covid pandemic. "Historically rainbows are known as a symbol of hope; a symbol that despite the darkness, storms or tribulations of life, can appear, evoking a feeling of peace. With each colour signifying an expression of hope, rainbows bring the promise that the troubles of today will come to pass," she said.

The free installation is made up of nearly 1000 rainbow-coloured umbrellas suspended above the rainforest via a network of interconnected steel structures designed to last.

The stunning display has had guests craning their heads skywards over the past few weeks as it has been installed. It's also proved a practical protection from the unusually wet weather experienced this autumn.



Council grants more than half a million dollars to local community groups

SUNSHINE Coast Council has announced more than \$550,000 will support 95 local projects in its latest Major Grants round.

Community Portfolio Councillor David Law said he was proud to see council continue to support a variety of projects which would provide community benefit well into the future.

"It's great to see so many Sunshine Coast community groups receive funding to deliver one-off projects, events and activities which benefit the entire region," Cr Law said.

"The successful funding recipients are certainly making a difference and contributing to our thriving community."

One community group set to benefit is the Maleny and District Men's Shed Incorporation, having been awarded \$6394 in the Community Facilities category towards erecting a new shed.

Men's Sheds play an import role in improving men's health and wellbeing by offering an inclusive and safe place for all men from a local community to come together, and by providing important health information.

Maleny and District Men's Shed Incorpora-

tion Secretary Lindsay Hay said he was thrilled the group had received a Major Grant with membership increasing recently.

"Our Men's Shed now has more than 50 members and the funding will go towards erecting shed recently donated by the Australian Defence Force and allow expansion of the Men's Shed's activities," Mr Hay said.

"Our members are excited to get into alternative activities such as leatherwork, lead lighting, cards and computers, as well as having a breakout space for meals and information ses-

Cr Law said in this round of funding, there were a lot of important community projects, including youth programs, creative and cultural events, and facility upgrades.



Local train layout may become a model in mental health care

A model train layout project designed to stimulate aged care residents' memories could become a pilot project for the nation.

The Sunshine Coast Model Railway Club spent seven months completing the twin-track layout for Estia Health Nambour with the help of a Dementia Australia grant and it was delivered last Tuesday.

"It is an incredible piece of art and will be a valuable focal point for our residents here," said Estia Health Nambour spokesperson Wendy May.

"This amazing team of men have done so much work for us to produce this magnificent item. We will be starting a men's group to go with it.

Wendy said the immersive nature of the layout would open up many lines of engagement for residents, especially since it was modelled on local scenes and history.

"The stories that we can tell," she said. "It will help entice people out of their rooms. It's going to bring back memories and encourage engagement. One of our residents is Allan Lanham and his dad started Lanhams Timber and Hardware (now Sunshine Mitre 10) and was deeply involved with the history of Nambour. Allan's going to love this."

The project was funded by a federal government Dementia Engagement

Modelling Program (DEMP) for people living with dementia in residential aged care to help with isolation and loneliness.

Secretary of the Sunshine Coast Model Railway Club Paul Downes said his members worked hard on a limited budget to get the best result for the residents. "We've been told this might be the pilot for other model railway clubs and for other aged care homes. That would be wonderful," Paul said.

"Wendy and I developed a brief of what she was looking for: two tracks, one elevated, one low, tunnels and bridges with crossovers.

"We wanted small focus-scenes that could be used to generate discussion and recall and assist with memory and general mental wellbeing for residents. Another requirement in the brief was the whole thing had to be encased and fully lockable. We had a budget of \$3000."

There's even a replica of one of the original cane trains that worked Nambour Sugar Mill

them and 3D printed them," said Paul.

Two HO scale trains - one freight, one passenger – will run from 9am-3pm all day giving residents plenty of time to discover its nooks and crannies.


"Because it was coming to Nambour the team decided outside the original brief 'why not throw in a sugar mill," said Paul.

'This has been the first layout that our members have been able to get their teeth into as a whole-club project for quite a while.

"Being able to do something for the residents here has definitely regenerated and rekindled our members' enthusiasm which had waned somewhat during the pandemic. It brought out the best in the guys and they really went the extra mile."

The layout includes cars and trucks, passengers and people and two trains (one freight one passenger).

Nambourians will recognise local landmarks such as Nambour Sugar Mill, Book Exchange, the Club Hotel, Nambour Plaza and the Nam-

"We've been working towards this for many years," Mandy said.

"Now we're building patches; using rain tanks.



New Featured Artist at Yandina Historic House





Growing interest in home schooling inspires Mum to set up online directory

A growing number of Sunshine Coast families are opting to educate their children at home, according to the founder of a website designed to assist parents do just that.

Homeschool Heart Founder Bethan Davies, of Ilkley, said the numbers of activities available to families became so vast she saw the need for a directory of "all things local and homeschool"

"In the last two years the homeschool community has transformed," Bethan said. "The number of families is much bigger and the connections between business and homeschoolers have grown and developed."

Much of the growth had been a result of parents' opposition to Covid and vaccine mandates.

"Many families removed their children following the introduction of masks and the desire not to vaccinate their children," she said.

"Plus during the lockdown schooling-athome period many parents found that their kids where significantly happier at home."

Bethan said teachers who left the system had begun to create new ways of sharing their knowledge and skills with others. She said with restrictions still in place for the education sector many teachers had opted to go it alone.

"This influx of families and educators has led to changes. Unlike previous homeschooling families, many of the new ones still need days with a drop off option for their kids.

"The numbers of activities available to families has become so big, I created a directory of all things local and homeschool.

"HomeschoolHeart.com.au is a labour of love to share the amazing offerings from people in our local communities. People will find a variety of options available to support our local kids. The creative ways business and families are working together is both heart-warming and inspiring. Homeschoolers are often out and about, learning within our community.

"A growing area is mentorship and skill sharing; local artists, craftspeople and professionals who would love to facilitate a small workshop or be a mentor are able to list on the directory. It feels like the Sunshine Coast and hinterlands are a melting pot of this new layer of education. Flowers are blooming in the mud."

The news follows meetings with Sunshine Coast Council which found that an application for a different licence for the venue might solve

Mr McLeish said that by operating as a "market" instead of a "food court", it would be permitted to continue its open mic and live entertainment nights.

The Monday and Friday weekly events held in the Maleny Lane were given a recent deadline to shut down after the council received noise complaints.

"I would like to thank the Maleny community for their amazing support," Mr McLeish

"We had over 200 letters of support and 4000 signatures on the petition as well as 350 people gathering in support of live music at the Maleny Lane. This indicates the importance of music and arts in our community. Live music creates opportunities for our young people, generates and stimulates wellbeing within the community and benefits the local economy."





When Nambour's baker delivered our daily bread

THIS beautiful calendar, right, titled The Soul's Awakening, was a Christmas gift to customers in 1904 from James Higginson Family Baker.

An advertisement in the Moreton Mail in 1896 read as follows:

James Higginson, baker, delivers First-class bread for cash to any resident within five miles from Nambour.

By 1904, Mr Higginson was the Proprietor of the Nambour Bakery and Railway refreshment rooms in Currie Street "where Hot Tea, Coffee and Cocoa are always ready".

While in 1907, the Chronicle & North Coast Advertiser reported that "James Higginson is still to be found in his refreshment room, where a glass of wine with any kind of baker's small goods can be obtained".

Hospital volunteers help patients get 'Better Together'

"There was a lady who came regularly to oncology and she would send her driver in to look for me so I could get a wheelchair and take her in. She didn't want the wardie, she wanted

"It makes you feel good when people appreciate you like that."

Acting SCHHS Senior Coordinator of Volunteer Services Angela Drew said highly valued volunteers played a vital role in keeping the health service running smoothly.

"They are often the first people visitors encounter at the hospital; they provide practical assistance as well as emotional support and comfort," Ms Drew said.

"Volunteers work alongside medical practitioners, assist nurses and help families on what

can be an emotional and tiring journey. "I would encourage any potential volunteers to consider joining our team."

SCHHS volunteers don't require any formal qualifications, just a friendly disposition and a willingness to learn, as well as a basic level of fitness.

Jewellery to catch the eye, capture sentiment

Business Writeup: Set Together Jewellery

SET Together Jewellery's Lisa Clune knew from an early age that she wanted to become a jew-

"I have been fascinated by gemstones and have loved drawing and design for as long as I can remember," said Lisa who recently set up a studio in Nambour. "I went into jewellery making and design straight out of year 12, and every day I feel so lucky to have found my passion so early in my life".

Lisa grew up in New Zealand and went to jewellery school at the end of high school.

"My training was in traditional goldsmithing and jewellery design and technique. All day, every day, I was at the bench learning the art of fine jewellery making," Lisa explained. "It was quite intense and proved to be fantastic grounding for my first experiences working for master jewellers in Melbourne".

At the end of her formal training, Lisa moved to Melbourne where she went to work for Master Jeweller, Frank Fedele.

"When I first arrived in Melbourne, I worked for Frank and a diamond dealer, and it was the most wonderful experience. After two years, I became the main jeweller in Frank's business and had the opportunity to create some incredible pieces," she said.

Lisa moved to Nambour last year and founded her own studio, Set Together Jewellery.

Over the years, Lisa has continued her education by studying gemology (the scientific study of gemstones), and is now a certified gemolo-

"I could talk for days about gemstones," said Lisa. "Every gemstone tells its own story, from when and where it was formed, to its mineral composition. And because of the mineral composition and crystal structure of gemstones, they are not only visually beautiful, they have all sorts of applications in science. They are an endless source of fascination to me. I source gems from around the world and have personal relationships with my gem merchants".

Lisa is not alone in this obsession. Humanity has always been fascinated by and in awe of gems, gold and silver.

"The earliest piece of jewellery discovered is 150,000 years old," said Lisa. "Long before

agriculture, humans were adorning themselves with jewellery. And I think this is what I love the most about what I do.

"Jewellery is so intensely personal and can be such a beautiful expression of personality and creativity".

Remodelling jewellery keeps history and sentiment alive

Lisa designs and makes new jewellery, such as wedding and engagement rings, and has an incredible talent for remodelling gold jewellery.

"I think this is my favourite thing to do," said Lisa. "It is so exciting to take existing jewellery and turn it into something new. It adds to its character and story in a way that is extremely gratifying. And sometimes a client will bring

me multiple pieces of jewellery that they rarely wear, and I combine them into one stunning piece that they will cherish".

The design process starts with a conversation about preferred styles.

"I weigh the jewellery to be remodelled and then I begin the redesign," Lisa explained. "I present clients with three initial concepts and we refine from there. My drawings make the

design as clear as possible. Generally, it takes three to four weeks to complete the process.

I personally like modern art deco style, but in terms of what I create, I enjoy anything a bit



NFORTUNATELY, people all around the world get scammed out of their hard-earned money every day. Here are some of the most common scams we see, and how to avoid them:

Dating & Romance

Con artists use fake social media or dating app profiles to try and enter into a relationship with the victim, in an attempt to get their money.

Protect Yourself: Never give money to anyone you've only met online, even if you feel like you've established a level of trust.

Threat & Penalty

These involve the scammer calling or sending mail and emails claiming you owe money, when in fact you don't.

Protect Yourself: Always connect the dots and try to recall if you have any connection to the alleged missed payment or fine. Follow-up with the entity threatening you and request documentation of any claims. If the threat was made via email, don't open any documents attached to it.

Unexpected money

Someone will contact you and inform you of money owed to you, and that you need to make an upfront payment to transfer the funds, which they will then disappear with.

Protect Yourself: The chances that a large sum of money unexpectedly falls into your lap are low. Be extremely wary of anyone trying to give you money, especially if they need you to send them money first.

Computer and mobile

Scammers may deploy spyware and malware that capture everything you type and or see on your computer, as well as ransomware, which locks or encrypts your computer until you pay a ransom.

Protect Yourself: Never download files, open attachments, or click links from untrustworthy websites or emails. Be sure to keep your passwords secure and regularly updated.





I'VE never been prouder to be part of the LNP team then I was last week when Shadow Minister for the Prevention of Domestic, Family and Sexual Violence and my good friend, Amanda Camm MP, stood up in Parliament for victims

Earlier this year the Queensland Government announced a review into the Forensic Scientific Services, pushed into doing so after delays and reported failings in the analysis of DNA evidence, particularly in cases of sexual assault, were highlighted in the media and from the LNP.

We've recently discovered the review does not go far enough. It falls well short of the changes that are required. Disappointingly, the review specifically excludes re-analysis of DNA samples in specific cases, meaning that thousands of victims will miss the chance to have their offenders found and held accountable for their actions.

In her speech in Parliament, Amanda recounted the story of a woman who was drugged while out with friends, raped, and after sitting in the hospital for hours waiting for a DNA swab, told that there was no DNA - not that they couldn't match the DNA, that there literally was none to be found, and they could not identify who her attacker was. That simply shouldn't

The LNP are pushing for the scope of this review to be expanded to include DNA reanalysis. We want proper justice for victims of sexual assault.

comes through the 5441 6200 Hotline it is sometimes difficult to comprehend the huge and varied impact that humans have on our wildlife.

Sadly, there have been native animals recently rescued after being shot. Why would someone do this? It is usually thought that people who injure animals are actually scared of them, and their reaction is to be cruel. Who could fear injury from a bird, possum, reptile or kangaroo? They aren't going to rush out and attack someone like a savage dog. It is incomprehensible.

Through it all, the priority is to assist any injured or orphaned wildlife. For those that we lose, we have to think of the many native animals that we have saved. That keeps us going.

Everyone can help to prevent human impact on this planet. Some everyday practices just need to change. Balloons cause immeasurable damage to animals when they are ingested, yet that is often not realized as they are set off into

The result may be the end of the life of a beautiful huge sea turtle or a vulnerable little platypus or a hungry water bird.

Safe disposal of our rubbish is imperative. Even human hair discarded on the beach or in the yard causes the death of birds. Recently one of our carers had a lovely little peewee, found alone on the ground, that lost use of both its legs due to entanglement by human hair.

Reminiscing. If only we got what we were promised ...

Today we look at yet another State Government transport study - this one conducted in collaboration with Queensland Transport (now Department of Transport and Main Roads), Caloundra City Council and the Maroochy and Noosa Shire Councils.

It was completed in 2007.

The SunTRAN initiative was designed to be yet another cohesive transport vision for the

But like so many State Government 'visions,' they remain mirages.

The key message from SunTRAN was that the road network in the Sunshine Coast cannot be expanded forever, and a more sustainable solution was increased investment in public transport and a cultural shift away from the private car to more sustainable modes of transport (walking, cycling and public transport).

The SunTRAN report was strongly supportive of construction of the CAMCOS (Caboolture to Maroochydore Corridor Study) rail and called for construction of the full corridor to be brought forward to 2015.

Despite Labor promising it to be finished by 2020, back in May 2007, the Queensland state government still prefers to play politics with it

Our local Councils have done everything in their power to get the Sunshine Coast a proper public transport network, while the state government has done everything in its power to stop it by providing little to no comparative funding.

Case in point - an article written on 5 May 2022 by Sunshine Coast Daily journalist; Tegan Annett.

In it she analysed the past 10 years of state budgets, from 2011 to 2021 and compared our Sunshine Coast rail and bus improvements over that time, to the Gold Coast.

The outcome was nothing short of being both

astonishing and grossly reprehensible.

It should've made headline news across the nation, such is the enormous disparity revealed

It found that just \$150.7 million had been spent on rail and bus improvements on the Sunshine Coast in the decade.

Over the same period, the Gold Coast received \$1.38 billion.

To put it into population parity, it equates to spending just \$439 per person for us on the Sunshine Coast, compared to \$2146 per person on the Gold Coast.

A five-times greater spend per capita.

No Premier or Transport Minister apology for their lack of spending on our region over the past decade. If the state government had kept their promises, the following is what you could have been enjoying today:

Mr Lucas said the State Government was delivering a range of significant transport projects and services on the Sunshine Coast;

• \$1.2 billion for the CAMCOS rail project into Maroochydore.

• \$1.2 billion on the North Coast rail line (Caboolture to Beerburrum to Landsborough, and Landsborough to Nambour), that's two tracks proper rail

• \$160 million on the Caloundra to Maroochydore quality bus corridor and public transport sta-


• \$60 million on cycle networks.

• \$12 million on TransLink station upgrades.


