# Surgery in the womb saves tiny Chelsea's life

A surgeon at Mater Mothers' Hospital in Brisbane has saved a tiny Nambour twin baby girl's life after operating on her while she was still in her mum's womb.

Nambour mum Ti Bridge spent Mother's Day with her toddler son Lachlan and her miracle baby Chelsea by her side – a bitter-sweet day without Chelsea's twin sister, Imogen.

Imogen, who sadly passed away before birth, was Chelsea's identical sister. They were diagnosed with rare twin-to-twin transfusion syndrome (TTTS), a life-threatening condition where both babies share one placenta.

In a bid to save both babies at just 18 weeks into Tia's pregnancy, Mater Maternal Fetal Medicine's Professor Sailesh Kumar performed a complex, minimally-invasive surgery known as Fetoscopic Laser Photocoagulation (FLP) - using a fetoscope to locate the abnormal blood vessel connections between the babies on the surface of the placenta and then sealing them using a laser.

The laser ablation stops the

spent Mother's Day together.

abnormal blood transfusion between the twins, and can be curative.

Prof Kumar said that without FLP neither of the siblings would have survived. About 20 FLP surgeries are performed each year in Queensland, and it is a known risk that losing one or even both twins after laser surgery is possible.

There are risks to the procedure including the possibility of demise

of both babies. However, parents are always counselled that there is a more than 80 per cent chance that at least one twin will survive," he said.

Tia, 30, said that almost four weeks after the surgery to save her twins, a scan revealed Imogen's heart had stopped beating. "I was shocked and devastated," she

said.

"I knew there was a higher chance they could both pass if I didn't do the surgery, but how could someone go through so many bad things?'

Tia Bridge described Chelsea, now seven months, as her "miracle baby".

"She was born at just 25 weeks' gestation weighing 635g, but she is now tipping the scales at almost 5kg. She is a very strong girl and has defied the odds," Tia said.

"She's sassy and knows what she wants. I can remember when she was so tiny, she would fit in the palm of my husband Toby's hand. Her skin was see-through and there was nothing to her.

"I was scared to see her like that, it was so overwhelming.

"Chelsea is the bravest person I have met. I love her to bits."

Despite experiencing breathing difficulties and battling multiple setbacks, baby Chelsea is a happy and cheeky little girl.

After more than four months receiving around-the-clock care in the Neonatal Critical Care Unit at Mater Mothers' Hospital, Tia said she could not thank the medical, nursing and midwifery teams at Mater enough. "The care we received was phenom-

enal.

"We always wanted to give Lachlan a sibling, and when she smiles her whole face lights up," she said.

"Mother's Day will be a pretty significant day for me.'

Doreen describes Camellia House as a hidden gem, showcasing not only the extensive collection of 750-plus camellias but also the maturity and beauty of the gardens.

"With sasanqua, japonica, and reticulata (Camellia) varieties in full bloom during winter, the garden becomes a stunning spectacle," she

said. "What you've also got here is garden maturity, which you can't buy. When it's all blooming it

The property also features a century-old pineapple packing shed, magnificent historical poinciana shade trees, an ornamental lake with a ferry folly, statues and manicured lawns.

The poincianas are thought to be some of the oldest, if not the oldest, in Australia.

The heritage packing shed is filled with collectibles, antiques, bric-a-brac, jewelry and plants available for sale. Visitors can also indulge in a cup of freshly brewed coffee from the barista van.

# *Sculpture on the Edge* to grow to an 18-Day arts experience

SCULPTURE on the Edge, the renowned annual event, is set to take on a bigger role in the broader arts scene, according to Director Gretchen Keelty.

Now in its 13th year, the event continues to grow, showcasing a captivating exhibition of selected entries by artists from near and far. This year, the event will return to the picturesque Flaxton Gardens in November-December, offering an 18-day immersive creative experience for all to enjoy. The program will feature not only the annual exhibition but also workshops, artist talks, special events, and a diverse range of art forms.

"We're growing Sculpture on the Edge into an 18-day event, based around the existing annual competition," said Gretchen.



Mandalas – symbolic shapes used in medita-



tion practice – are a recurring motif. She uses a compass, a protractor and lots of maths to map out the location of the shapes.

"Mandala painting really gives you peace of mind because it is repetitive you get into a meditative state. It's good for your mind. The world is such a busy, stressful place that it's really calming for your mind," she said. "I love doing art, but it's also my therapy."



3. Consider using a password manager and multi-factor authorisation apps for added layers of security.

### **Building a Wildlife-friendly Biosphere on the Coast**

THIS week WILVO representatives were invited to a meeting to discuss the Sunshine Coast Council's Macropod Conservation Plan. Some years in the making, WILVOS have attended each meeting, as one of the key stakeholders.

We were fortunate to hear Dr Bev Brunton's update on the University

of the Sunshine Coast's Eastern Grey Kangaroos genetics project. It was interesting to hear more about their local diversity. Through development this diversity is affected by structures such as roads and buildings blocking movement. Suburban and small rural blocks often use fencing methods that block pathways that had previously been traversed by native animals.

Jacqueline, the Council's Senior Natural Areas Planner, presented the draft and I was struck by the practicality of it.

Sometimes information comes to me in unexpected ways, like when I received a copy of the meeting minutes for the Beerburrum to Nambour Rail Upgrade. The document, from March 2 2023, titled Beerburrum to Nambour Rail Upgrade (B2N) Environmental Matters Update, provides a detailed overview of the project, including what has been accomplished and what still needs to be done.

One interesting point raised is why certain works have not yet been completed.

As regular readers may recall, I have previously discussed concerns regarding the budget allocation for this project since its announcement in June 2018. In an op-ed published in the Sunshine Valley Gazette on 23 June 2021 titled 'What they budget is NOT what they spend,' I highlighted this issue.

The March 2023 document focuses on the environmental aspects of the project. It mentions that several ecological assessments have been conducted within the proposed corridor between 2005 and 2022. Additionally, surveys were carried out to assess fish and aquatic habitats, as well as targeted studies of frogs, including the Giant Barred Frog and the Wallum Sedge Frog. Koala surveys were also conducted, although no koalas were found.

The minutes indicate that various approvals have already been obtained, including those under the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC), as well as permits for protected plants and the High-Risk Species Management Program (SMP). Furthermore, no Threatened Environmental Communities were identified within the project area.

Water quality monitoring has been ongoing for the past 12 months at intersecting waterways. Although the minutes primarily discuss the Beerburrum to Beerwah rail project, it mentions that water quality can also be monitored at Nambour and Landsborough as part of the early works.



The minutes refer to the detailed design for stage 1 funded B2N works, in future tense.

This is no surprise as it was acknowledged in the 14 April 'non-released to the public' Media Release (damn those trucks).

It acknowledges that detailed designs for stage 1 works are not completed, despite almost five years having passed since saying it was go!

Further, it notes that the concept design for the unfunded stage 2 works has not yet commenced due to a lack of funding ...

This delay might be a blessing in disguise since the originally proposed stage 2 would lock in the twisted alignment for decades.

According to the 2011 Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) drawings, the rail corridor to Nambour has the capacity to accommodate four tracks (another story involving trucks and mishaps), but let's not digress. The impasse we face is due to the Queensland government's refusal to fund more than 30% of the downgraded project, which means that duplicated track falls short by 4km of reaching Landsborough (at Beerwah). Consequently, a new bus interchange and a 300-bay park'n'ride expansion (due to open June 2023) will have to await the arrival of a second track. My point being that these grand new improvements only serve the single track. It's absurd planning. The timing of this development now rests with the state government since the change in federal government has left them with no one else to blame for the lack of funding. Given the history of broken promises regarding rail infrastructure and Annastacia's refusal to properly fund our infrastructure,

it's possible that the opposition after 2024

may well fit back into a Tarago... again.





## How hi-tech tree homes will help save precious wildlife

AN Australian-first research project will trial a solution to provide cosy homes for the hinterland's tree loving wildlife.

In the peaceful Baroon Pocket Environment Reserve, in Mapleton, 77 hardwood nest boxes have been installed amongst the tree canopy to mimic hollows that would otherwise take hundreds of years to develop naturally. These are hoped to create safehouses for precious creatures, including the powerful owl, cockatoos, squirrel glider, greater glider, possum, micro bats and antechinus - a small mouse-like native marsupial - and help us learn more about their secret world. Sunshine Coast Council's Natural Areas Officer Steven Milner said biodiversity within a reserve relied on a plentiful supply of suitable habitat for wildlife. "On the Sunshine Coast there is a lack of natural hollows for birds such as the powerful owl, or marsupials, like the antechinus, to live in," Mr Milner said. "This is because it can take up to 150 to 200 years for trees to age, go into decline and hollows to form. Very few trees here are that old due to past successive logging. Nest boxes are bridging the gap – fast forwarding time to create instant habitat for our wildlife today. This greatly benefits our region's biodiversity and supports the survival of these species for generations and generations to come."

#### **Community Pharmacies raise concerns** about new dispensing policy

A number of community pharmacies on the Sunshine Coast are under threat due to Labor's new policy on dispensing medicines.

My Coalition colleagues and I have called for the government to guarantee that its new policy will NOT:

• adversely affect medicine supplies; and

 increase medicine stockpiling and wastage. If you're visiting a community pharmacy, please be conscious of the pressure they're under.

Some pharmacists are worried about the sustainability of their business model and many staff worry about the future of their jobs.

Our depleting wildlife numbers are a community problem, not only an issue for Council and Government. Residents do need to co-exist with native animals as we choose to live in what hopefully will be a wildlife friendly biosphere. Planning in years past did not reflect the present concern for the future of our wildlife.

Such rapid development would not have been anticipated and the knowledge of wildlife in a suburban landscape was limited.

Many practical solutions are offered in this Macropod Conservation Plan. I'd love to see everyone read this Plan and mark on the map where macropods are seen. There is a comments section as feedback to the draft plan. We need to let the Council know we care about our macropods and their future.

# Firefighting crew training hones skills, teamwork

AROUND 75 Rural Fire Brigade volunteers from across the region participated in joint training exercises on the weekend to hone their skills and get to know neighbouring crews.

"The training day involved bringing together the 11 brigades within the Maroochy South group, as many crew as we can get from those brigades," said Nigel Kemp, Group Officer of Maroochy South.

"It's a day of working with each other, a team building exercise, learning what your neighbouring brigade can do, who the people are in those brigades, what the trucks are capable of doing, and we had a good day and a bit of fun doing it. It's tasks we would do daily on the fire ground, just in a less-pressure, less-intense, friendlier environment. It gives you time to think about what you're doing rather than when you're on the fire ground when the pressure is on."

The exercises included: reversing a fire truck blindfolded while being guided only by a colleague's radioed directions, pumping water from a dam to refill the fire truck, towing a bogged truck, using hoes to dig a small fire break, four wheel driving along rugged bush tracks, fun team-building activities, all combined with practiced radio communications with Incident Control.

The exercises were hosted by Kureelpa Rural Fire Brigade. Crews that attended were from Bli Bli, Eudlo, Ilkley, Kiel Mountain, Kureelpa, Mapleton, Montville, Obi Obi, and Palmwoods. Mr Kemp has noted that high rainfall over recent years will potentially lead to high fuel loads on Sunshine Coast bushland areas, so crews need to be extra vigilant for upcoming fire seasons.

"Thanks to events like this, when we see a neighbouring truck pull up beside us at a major fire event, we know who they are, what they can do, we know what their truck can do. We all get to work together and learn each other's talents and capabilities, so we know that when the fire season ramps up, we're right to go."

"Without the support of donors, I'd be driving 100 kilometres every day, and I couldn't manage that for a second, so thank you, sincerely."




