NAMBOUR'S burgeoning arts and culture reputation has been boosted by the arrival of Peace Run Records & Agency. Owner and renowned singer, songwriter and producer Andrea Kirwin couldn't resist setting up shop in the quaint Queen Street location.

"I love Nambour. I'm always out there promoting Nambour," she said. "I think it has such potential to be like the Melbourne of Queensland. It's got all this culture and art scene vibe.

# Drug services need to move: MP

A mobile police beat in the CBD and relocating needle exchange and drug rehabilitation services back to the hospital were key strategies that would help improve safety in Nambour, according to Member for Nicklin Marty Hunt.

"In conjunction with (landlords)

C-square we met with Queensland Health a number of times in relation to moving these services out of the square and into the hospital or other premises. These services may be important in our community but it is a conflict of land use to have people in distressed states attending family precincts where we have cinemas and cafes.

"Queensland Health disagreed. However they have been working with us on a solution to possibly move the entrance of the needle exchange

to a more private location." Mr Hunt said he wanted to work with all parties to move more family-friendly health services into the tenancy. He said drug rehab and needle exchange services should not be "outsourced" to the CBD.

"I don't think it is appropriate," he said. "Queensland Health suggest that people seeking help shouldn't be

shunned by the community, but it's not about that to me. It's about putting appropriate services together. That's what urban planning is about.

"The ongoing issues surrounding these services in the middle of Nam-

bour have shown that it is incompatible." Still, Mr Hunt said there were a number of

"There is a bigger picture here. Over time we have seen a decline in the justice system. Courts not dealing with recidivist offenders according to community expectations and a failure to provide laws to give police the powers they need to keep the community safe. We need to bring back breach of bail as an offence and overhaul the youth justice and child safety systems.

"We are letting families down and the police are frustrated that in the end they are left to try and pick up the pieces of a failed system."

Mr Hunt said he understood a mobile police beat would be available soon, in the form of a purpose built-van that included an office.

He said the service would be permanently available on the Sunshine Coast "as I understand it". He hoped the initiative would involve police 'walking a beat' but could not say how regularly the service might patrol Nambour's CBD.

In last fortnight's Gazette a Sunshine Coast Police spokesperson said plans were well under way for further operations that will again target anti-social behaviour in the CBD.

crime will ramp up following a lull during Covid. The woman said she had seen so many incidents around her shop that she held fears for her and her staff's safety

The woman, who didn't want to be named, has witnessed shocking violence, drug dealing, alcohol abuse and prostitution and was relieved the situation had significantly improved during

"This all happened pre-Covid and since Covid there has not really been the same situation or problems," she said.

"But in the last few weeks there have been some regulars who have dribbled back to the square. However I've only rung the police once, whereas prior to Covid I was phoning almost daily, Monday to Friday.

"I think we need to take action now to ensure that it stavs this way."

She said the safety problem was "so unfair to the amazing people living in Nambour and just serves to perpetuate a negative image".

"The only thing that I have seen work, which has a direct and immediate impact and stops the problem, is to have police doing foot patrols. The problem people literally run away. Whereas they're not worried if they see

She said, like many others in town, she had tried to change things but her efforts ended up falling on deaf ears and resulted in blowback from locals for criticising the town.

She said, in addition to police foot patrols, all local community groups should be encouraged to "take back the town", in a positive way, by holding regular events in the square. Schools should be encouraged to use the stage for concerts, she said. Buskers and musicians should also be invited to lift the mood. And a security camera linked to the police station would help.

"School and community group involvement will bring parents to the square, make other people feel safe and give a sense of pride to the

### Live-streamed concerts direct from Nambour

And her online events, staged from the shop, have been drawing wide interest. "So, I do livestream boutique concerts on our little stage here, where we sell tickets for a virtual concert that you can watch anywhere in the world,

direct from Queen Street, Nambour. "Our aim is to do these shows and give the videos — which are really top, top quality — to the artists. We pay them to play, just a small fee at the moment because I'm investing my own money into it.

"But my goal is to start paying them really well, plus create footage for them so they can continue to promote themselves."

Andrea's entrepreneurial journey to Peace Run Records began as an independent singer-songwriter when she realised she would have to produce her own music. "Record labels don't come to your door and offer you lots of money to record your own music," she said.

"So, I set up Peace Run Records through the NEIS (New Enterprise Incentive Scheme) back in 2009. And the name originated from basically running your music career peacefully, along with a family life and doing it within a community.

"It's always been a goal of mine to make music but not have to tour, because touring is really not as glamorous as you think it is. It's a big investment and, because of the amount of entertainment available to people, crowds aren't going to gigs like they used to.

"I did three tours with the release of my three albums and I lost money every time because



of the outlay of flights for bands and things like that. So, live-streamed concerts are a way of engaging with an international audience through the internet. And we don't have to spend nine months of the year away from our

Interestingly, Teddy, a 10-week-old Wheaten border collie has quickly settled in to life in Queen St and comes to work with Andrea. The former SmartPups dog trainer said she would train Teddy to help out.

"I'll be training him to be, basically, a music therapy dog where, when kids come in to learn, might be feeling a bit anxious, and they can cuddle Teddy.

"It helps bring out their voice because, often, when you feel nervous, it constricts your vocal cords. Having a dog always relaxes people and moves them into being present." Div 10 Cr David Law said he was thrilled to

hear about Andrea's business and encouraged by the creative talent being drawn to Nambour.

"Working with people on the Special Entertainment Precinct, even prior to the election, and watching what they have been able to achieve in spite of COVID is amazing," he said.

"There are a couple of venues that are on a musical journey at the moment and having Andrea launch Peace Run Records recently

### Project identifies local species, adds interest to park walks

A promising local plant species identification project has been resurrected 20 years after it

Bush Care Sunshine Coast Coordinator Norm Morwood re-activated the plan after he became aware of a stockpile of unused engraved nameplates of prominent local species. "One of the main purposes of the name plate project is that people get to know the local plants and might plant the ones they like in their own places," he

So Petrie Creek Catchment Care Group volunteers began work to place the nameplates at Namba Creek (the model Rail Park in Nambour) on Saturday where they carry out regular regeneration work.

"Twenty years ago Petrie Creek Catchment Care Group started a project to have the names of local species trees applied in public places," "They produced some engraved name plates

and built concrete bases. Unfortunately at the time they could not get permission from Council to install them.

"I have obtained funding from Petrie Creek Catchment Care Group to do some corrections obvious gaps and we now have Council permis-

Norm has been a Bush Care Coordinator since 2012 at three sites: Namba Creek, Florabunda Pocket at Victory Park and "Gulung Gung" which are local Gubbi Gubbi/Kabi Kabi words for "Family Connections Country". Gulung Gung is just downstream from Quota Park and we work at a few sites there in what is to become a new council park," said Norm. Like other volunteers, Norm found catch-


ment care work incredibly satisfying. "It is an enjoyable, pleasant and rewarding way to contribute to the wellbeing of the planet," he said. "It's the planting. It's the growing the natives and looking after the wildlife. And making a habitat for the wildlife. That's what we do, and it's fantastic. You put a few plants in, and you pull a few weeds out, and eventually it turns into a fantastic thing like that," he said pointing to a healthy forest of native regrowth.

"The achievements on the sites are due to the enthusiasm and efforts of the teams of volunteers who come each working bee to give their time and skills and share the satisfaction."



If elected the Greens would buy back every privately-owned carpark at a public hospital and establish a \$500 million fund to upgrade and expand public hospital parking in areas of need. Patients will be able to allocate their free parking to a friend or family member, with parking tickets validated by hospital reception. This would include anyone seeking treatment at a public hospital, including outpatients.

The total cost of introducing free hospital parking for patients and staff in all public hospi tals will be \$323 million over four years, including \$268 million to buy back the seven privatised carparks and \$54 million covering lost revenue from hospital car parking fees and rent.

The plan will be funded by the Greens' plan to raise royalties on mining corporations, which will raise \$55 billion over four years.

Small business owner Sue Etheridge says the plan will go a long way to easing cost of living pressures for everyday people.

"Whenever you need to go to hospital because you're sick or visiting a family member or friend, the last thing you need to worry about is how big your parking bill is going to be," she said.

"Hospital parking fees place a massive burden on patients and their families and friends, with some people being forced to sleep in their cars rather than fork out money for parking.

"We'll reverse Labor and the LNP's privatisation of our public hospital assets, put money back into the pockets of hardworking health care workers and ensure sick people aren't taxed just for having to go to hospital."

### Water tank owners prompted to top up

UNITYWATER is encouraging residents who are not connected to the town water supply to check their tanks and book water deliveries.

Unitywater's Katherine Gee said after combined South East Queensland dam levels dropped below 60 percent in September, it was timely for those who rely on tank water to con-

"It's getting warmer, dam levels have dropped and it's dry across our region," Ms Gee said.

"Despite the La Nina forecast and predictions for a wet summer, rain may not fall hard or soon enough, or in the right places.

"We've received phone calls from some residents on tanks who are close to running out or have run out of water already so it's really important to check tank levels regularly."

Ms Gee said Unitywater fill stations for commercial water carriers were open 24 hours a day, with the exception of the Landsborough site which was open 6am - 10pm. Unitywater also provides access to three community fill stations across the service region where residents can fill containers for \$4.35 per 1000 litres of water, and these are also open 24 hours a day.

"We installed our community fill stations earlier this year in response to community feedback and these provide an option for residents to obtain drinking water while they wait for their water delivery. They're located in Cooroy, Nambour and Warner," she said.

"We can't always rely on the rain and empathise with residents on tank water during periods of dry weather."

World War One were treated free. It was gazetted as a general public hospital in May 1921.

It is a rural facility providing services to the Maleny region, including accident and emergency (24-hours a day, seven days a week

### Mooloolah Valley resident wins tech award for research

MOOLOOLAH Valley resident Dr Elke Hacker has won the prestigious Sue Wickenden Innovation in Science award at the 2020 Women in Technology Awards on October 9.

Dr Hacker is a world-leading postdoctoral researcher in the skin cancer field at the Institute of Health and Biomedical Innovation at the Queensland University of Technology.

Over the past 10 years she has expanded her research from invitro lab models to human clinical studies, which have generated results that improve understanding of the relationship between sun exposure, genetic-susceptibility, and skin cancer risk.

Dr Hacker's extensive research portfolio led to the development of various smartphone apps and other devices that reliably collect UVR exposure data to measure sunburn risk, ensure sunscreen supplies in public locations are replenished and remind people when it is time later in 2006. to take precautions.

Through various partnerships, Dr Hacker continues to utilise technology to make headway in preventing skin cancer, a prominent issue experienced by many Australians.

### **Couple draws** strength from experience to offer respite for carers

AFTER months of testing Vince O'Rourke's first wife Margaret, at just 59, was diagnosed with Young Onset Alzheimer's disease.

The shock of the diagnosis turned to grief when Margaret was informed she had a terminal illness. It was heart-wrenching to tell their three adult children.

Loss became the central theme as Margaret lost the ability to talk and abilities to dress, shower, toilet and feed herself.

Vince's six-year journey of caring, became a time of isolation. Family members and friends who couldn't cope with the changes "left them". It was difficult to go out as Margaret was incontinent and noise disturbed her.

Fatigued and needing time-out, Vince realised he had to place Margaret in respite and later in a nursing facility.

The decision and separation spiralled him into guilt and grief. Margaret died nearly a year

Now Vince and his second wife Lorrae draw strength from their personal experience to help those going through similar journeys by hosting carers for well-earned breaks at their Nambour home - Carers Outlook.

The story will be re-enacted using a pit saw and other early tools, with the final product a digital story for display in Fairview.

Friends of Pattemore House Inc president Gail Denver said they were thrilled to receive the Heritage Levy Grant.

"We're going to work with a conservation architect and local filmmaker to re-enact and film a demonstration of pit sawing and timber hand planing, using tools authentic to the period," Ms Denver said.

"The film will become part of a permanent display at Fairview for our visitors to enjoy."

### Capture leads with laser precision

Business Advice

PRECISION in being able to identify and contact your potential customers and convert them into Leads is the holy grail when it comes to eventually generating sales. One of my clever clients recently generated 75 potential sales at \$2,200 dollars a sale from a single \$70 Facebook Ad. And they did it in just one week!!! How were they able to achieve that?

The analogy I will use is about shining a light on, and for, potential customers.

At one extreme is "floodlighting". Making sure you get your advertisement to as many customers as possible using lots of energy and resources and spending a lot of money. The "floodlighting" analogy also extends to "floodlighting" your products or services so as many people as possible can "see" them, and choose accordingly.

If you have plenty of money, can run large television and radio and internet campaigns to build brand strength - "floodlight" away. Few small and medium sized businesses have the resources to take that approach. Could you compete with a JB Hi-Fi Ad campaign?

The other end of the spectrum (excuse the light pun) is to use a "laser" approach to illuminating both your potential customers and what you have to sell them by way of products or services. This "laser" approach minimises the resources you need, can cost very little and ends up with a much better customer experi-

My clever client followed the advice on this laser approach - most likely getting more than \$100,000 in sales from a \$70 Ad!

There are two components to the "laser" approach:

Know your customer

Make compelling offers

#### Know your customer

What do you need to know about your customer? There are the obvious demographics of gender, location, income bracket, family makeup, and age bracket. There are also the less obvious ones of business interests, and personal interests. And then there is more, including current sentiment, desires, concerns, fears to name a few. The better you know your customer the better you can direct your marketing and advertising to arrive on their doorstep (physical or digital) in a way that is appealing to them and engages with them.

#### Make compelling offers

What is a "compelling" offer? This is an offer that a) is compelling in its own right as far as it is valuable to a potential customer; b) matches with the interests, desires, fears, or concerns of that potential customer; c) is super easy and quick to obtain; AND d) it is a single offer - no choices involved.

You can see that the first step of Know your customer helps you to understand what a "compelling" offer might be. By the way, the offer does not have to be one of your products or services. It could be from another supplier who gives them to you for a bulk discount or some other consideration that could be beneficial to both parties.

The example I gave of my clever client is by far the best result they have ever had in 14 vears of business. It is because they adopted the "laser" approach. It took some time to work through - but the results speak for them-


