## Light at end of tunnel

RESIDENTS kept awake by noisy air-conditioners on trains parked at Woombye's stabling facility will be pleased to hear they may be sleeping tight by the end of the year.

Queensland Rail is working to return the air-conditioning levels on parked trains from "in-service mode" to the quieter "stabling mode" as soon as possible.

A Transport and Main Roads (TMR) spokesperson said about a third of the multi-billion dollar Next Generation Rollingstock (NGR) fleet had now had their stabling mode reinstated. "This upgrade will be rolled out across the remainder of the NGR fleet throughout 2021."

The yard, near the Woombye station, holds trains when they are not in use.

Trouble is, since the facility became operational last February nearby residents have complained of noise from the air-conditioners.

QR admitted last year the units were kept

running to avoid an inherent mould and odour problem, the result of a design fault in the near-new, Indian-built fleet.


But they say air-conditioners running at in-service mode are no louder than surrounding ambient noise in the area. TMR carried out two noise monitoring surveys last year: "Both of which indicated that noise from the stabled passenger trains (including their air conditioning systems) was not the source of

excessive noise being reported by residents," a TMR statement said.

"While Queensland Rail's noise monitoring report advised that the Woombye stabling yard operations (including the NGR air-conditioning systems) have not been identified as a dominant contributor to the local noise environment at Woombye, TMR is working to return

## **Council must weigh parking** against streetscape beauty

"WE want the design but we also want the parking". With that sentence Woombye Community and Business Association president Debbie Kimber summed up the mood of the town and the conundrum it faced as Council considers feedback to its Draft Concept Plan for Woombye's Streetscape.

The community has had its say on the Plan with WCBA heavily involved in the process.

WCBA has said car parking remained a major issue for Woombye traders. It said any plan needed to balance the benefits of parking with traffic calming, pedestrian experience and maintaining Woombye's historic charm.

Woombye did not want to see any short term net loss of parking spaces until potential long term solutions could be achieved, the WCBA submission said.

"We feel the beautification of the main street should be considered an asset for future generations and parking needs to be addressed as a long-term issue.

"We acknowledge that parking is inadequate and can deter customers. There are opportunities for future additional parking, land behind the established shops (SPAR through to Kimnat) that could be purchased and developed into a parking area.

"Traffic speed has become an issue of most concern, despite Blackall Street being a 40km/

WCBA said proposed raised speed humps and raised pedestrian crossings would greatly assist in slowing traffic and provide a safer pedestrian

It fully supported the focus on Woombye's heritage in the concept plan, and will work with Council to deliver interpretive signage for the Woombye Heritage Trail. "The Woombye community is proud of our town, and maintaining the existing feel of Woombye is important."

The association said it supported the proposed upgrade of raised planter beds in Blackall Street, and suggested that similar treatments may be appropriate around other beds such as the Poinciana tree outside Woombye Butcher shop. "We note that the raised bed between the Newsagent and St Margaret's only contains flowers. We recommend the removal of this bed and a car parking space is reinstated."

WCBA said concept plans from 2015 that had proposed to build a gable roof extension projecting over the front deck of the School of Arts looked promising.

"From images we have viewed it appears to be a desirable outcome and an asset to the town's streetscape. We understand that further consultation with the School of Arts committee will be undertaken. We see the benefit of a raised pedestrian crossing by the School of Arts. However, at the cost of 3 or 4 car spaces it is difficult

the air-conditioning levels on NGR trains to the normal stabling mode as soon as possible.

"Upgrades are being rolled out to the air-conditioning systems on the New Generation Rollingstock (NGR) train fleet. The upgrade includes a restoration of the standard NGR stabling mode.

Woombye residents James Kasmer and Mike Melzer, who have proved thorns in the side of TMR over the issue, said they were grateful for any progress but were not holding their breath.

Mr Kasmer said it had already taken twothirds of the year to fix one third of the trains. "Two-thirds of the calendar year having already passed. I remain hopeful TMR and QR keep their word on the air-conditioning fix, despite the bulk of the work is left to complete within the remainder of the 2021 year."

He said Queensland Rail's noise monitoring reports conducted in the second half of 2020 were red herrings.

"These NGR Trains are extremely noisy when not stored in Stabling Mode. Noise continues unabated whether it be day or night. This is why residents in Woombye remain focussed on a solution to ongoing noise problems from trains not stored in stabling mode.'

Mr Melzer said TMR should have sent "a human" to experience the noise generated by

"Friends and others who visited our properties were all amazed at the intrusive level of noise," he said. "For TMR to insinuate we are imagining it is offensive."

## **NZ violinist Amalia Hall to** perform at Lucas Parklands

INTERNATIONALLY acclaimed New Zealand violinist Amalia Hall will make a whirlwind visit to Lucas Parklands on the Sunshine Coast in September, to join in her first international performances in almost 18 months.

In an extremely unique occasion, Ms Hall will perform with world-class Australian-born soprano Alexandra Flood, who is returning from Europe for a tour, and captivating Australian pianist Michael Ierace, in the Lucas Parklands auditorium on September 25 and 26.

'It's a wonderful thing in the music industry to meet people and to forge musical partnerships and to collaborate together for performances; and just to have something really spontaneous on stage and be able to explore that in the performance," Ms Hall said of the pending Lucas Parklands concerts.

"I'm really looking forward to it, I've never been to the Sunshine Coast so that's going to be really exciting, and also I've heard wonderful things about the Lucas Parklands venue itself so I'm really looking forward to being able to perform there."

Ms Hall's appearance at Lucas Parklands in Montville is a coup for local lovers of classical music, and for venue owner Ian Lucas, who organised what are her only two appearances before she jets back for her ongoing concert commitments in New Zealand.

The violin virtuoso is a graduate of the prestigious Curtis Institute of Music, and has impressed with her soloist performances with leading world orchestras, including in Italy, Germany, the Czech Republic, Romania and

Mexico, with her concerts extending around the globe to the USA, China, South Africa, Vietnam and more, including Australia.

"Usually I spend a couple of months each year overseas for performances - in Mexico, England, Italy, Australia, all different places - and this has actually been the longest I've been in New Zealand since I was 18," Ms Hall explained.

"So, even just to be going just across the ditch to Australia is a really nice feeling, I'm looking forward to be able to get out of New Zealand and go back a little bit to what life was like before

Ms Hall developed a deep passion for the violin as a child. She made her debut with the Auckland Philharmonia orchestra at age 9 and won numerous awards in her teens, before embarking on her much-lauded international career. "My parents really loved music, so they started my siblings playing violin as a hobby, and I just wanted to copy them and really play violin too, and ever since then it's been my real focus," Ms Hall explains.

"And it's always such a joy to share music wherever I do go, whether it's in New Zealand or elsewhere; music is just this amazing thing that can unite people and bring them together for a shared experience, so it's really quite special."

She has met Ms Flood previously, but it will be her first time meeting Mr Ierace. It will be their first time performing together, and it promises to be something unique.




The Strawbfest Mega Raffle will be drawn on Friday 10 September and winners will be notified via email.

# Staff recall memories of Big Pineapple at sweet reunion

#### 'It was such a magical place'

IT is our sweetest icon which was once the Coast's biggest employer.

The Big Pineapple lived up to its larger than life image when it opened in 1971 and the memories loom large to this day.

Last month former staff looked back on the early days of Woombye's Big Pineapple at a 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary reunion.

"Back in the day every teenage kid in Woombye had a job at the Big Pineapple," said former employee Pam Thomas.

"At one stage I was doing a roster for 200 people."

Pam said her former colleague Patsy Flint was there from the first day the place opened.

"People loved Patsy to death," said Pam.

"She's 91 this year everyone knows and loves Patsy. She was here stitching the canopy on to the train the night before we opened, and she's here today."

"We'd go and unload the pineapples out of the pineapple crates and bring them upstairs to the entrance and we'd have to stack them three times a day because people coming through the gates would buy them so fast," said Joanne Kingston.

"I remember the parfait bar line up was six deep at the counter," said Pam. "Our record was 32 coaches in one day they all had lunch ... they'd stream in to the restaurant and shop their way back to the bus."

"The temperature hit 45 degrees one day and we had to keep working," recalled Sharon Lymer.

"It was so tropical. We had every type of hibiscus and they were used to decorate the tables with the salads. It was just magic."

Author Kerry Brown whose 2011 book 'Our Sweetest Icon' celebrates the Big Pineapple story, organised the function.

"From the day it opened in 1971, the Big Pineapple was such an amazing place and represents such a rich chapter of the nation and Queensland's history.

"It was such a magical place. Everyone wondered how trains and parfaits could go wrong.

"When I did the book I remember a lot of people crying tears of happiness as the memories came flooding back"



PD Rambo had been with Sgt Grigoris, since the police dog's graduation in 2015.


The portrait was presented to him last week. Sgt Grigoris was very grateful for the painting and said "this portrait has captured his eyes and

## Grant helps Compass trainees plot course to independence ...

IN April this year, the Compass Institute opened its doors to a new Campus at C-Square in the heart of Nambour.



## **Concerns loom large over** telecommunications tower

WOOMBYE residents are bristling at the thought of a 40 metre high telecommunications tower being plonked near the middle of town.

A larger than usual Woombye Community and Business Association meeting at Woombye Pub last Tuesday night heard residents' concerns about the Notice of Development Application for the proposed telecommunication tower at 1-9 Campbell Street.

New South Wales Company Stilmark Group wants to erect the tower which would stand almost twice as tall as the 22 metre high lights at Woombye Snakes football fields or about the height of a 12 storey building.

The site is in the rural zone, however it is essentially in an urban environment in close proximity to residential dwellings.

WCBA Vice President Grant Palethorpe

reassured the meeting there was plenty of time for the community to voice its concerns to Council. The application was

impact assessable meaning it would have to pass council's assessment and also public scru-

Mr Palethorpe said "Council have completed an initial assessment and have requested that the applicant provide a range of additional information".

Key information requested by Council includes:

- evidence that the location minimises the impact on the amenity of nearby residents;
- · a list of alternate sites which were considered and the reasons why those sites weren't selected;
- Landscape Plan to show how the proposal integrates in the local area and is not visually intrusive;
- Visual impact assessment report to address all affected residential properties within 400m;
- · the predicted electromagnetic radiation from the proposed facility ensuring it does not cause human exposure beyond accepted precautionary limits;
- · technical information to demonstrate the

need for this facility and why co-location/ upgrading of existing facilities is not possible;

· a coverage map to demonstrate the area proposed to be serviced by the facility.

"Council are following the processes and we'll be waiting until we see the applicant's response to Council's well considered and very relevant questions.

"Any submission needs to be based on planning merit, not emotion."

The applicant is due to provide this information by 19 November 2021, once submitted Council will then continue their assessment, with public notification to follow shortly after.



## Little badge creates lasting Legacy on local families

LEGACY Week 2021 kicked off on Saturday (August 28) and Mayor Mark Jamieson is highlighting the vital work of the Legacy group.

Starting in 1942, Legacy Week, or "Badge Week" as it is known, is the annual national appeal to raise awareness of the families of Australian Defence Force men and women who have lost their lives or have ongoing health issues.

Mayor Jamieson said Legacy was a source of support and advocacy for the families of Veterans - often through the most challenging time in their lives - providing long-term social, emotional, development and financial support.

Local Bli Bli widow, and mother of two, Supranee Radosevich's husband passed away in 2010 from cancer, after having served as a United Nations Peacekeeper in East Timor.

Sunshine Coast Legacy Group reached out to Mrs Radosevich in 2016 with funding assistance to support the education of her two children, Chloe and Jayden (now aged 14 and 13).

"The support I received from Legacy has been wonderful and it's had a really positive impact on my children's future," Mrs Radosevich said.

"Helping out with Badge Week fundraising is a way of giving back and saying thank you for the support my family has received."

Mrs Radosevich has supported Legacy by selling badges every year since and will this year be joined by her children.

Legacy's clientele includes an increasing number of young incapacitated veterans, widows and families impacted by deployments such as East Timor, Iraq and Afghanistan.

Sunshine Coast Legacy has around 40 volun-

teers who support nearly 900 Legacy clients, including children and people with a disability.

Sunshine Coast Chairman Lee Shimbel said that the focus on the Sunshine Coast was to ensure that the partners and children of Veterans who gave their lives or health in military service are supported to achieve their full potential.

"These families have already been through so much, watching their loved ones leave the safety of our shores to serve our country, with many never returning or others returning bearing the physical or mental scars of war," Mr Shimbel said.

We believe these families should not be at a disadvantage and we are helping young families at an increasing rate, nurturing children's education by contributing towards school fees, books, uniforms and recreational activities such as our annual Youth Camp to support their self-development and confidence.

"We also assist older widows through pension advocacy, counselling, special housing, medical needs and social support.

"While we are already supporting many widows and families, there are many more who desperately need our support."

## Interested in playing Scrabble?

MY CLUB: Sunshine Coast Scrabble Club

SCRABBLE originated in the USA in the 1930s. Initial uptake was slow but in the late 1940s it caught on, and the game spread like wildfire, firstly in the US and then in Australia and all around the world.

Scrabble is now played in dozens of different languages, leading to some interesting variations in letter value. For example, in English Scrabble the letter Z is worth ten points, but in Polish Scrabble only one point!

Winning at Scrabble involves not just a knowledge of words. Just as important is working out where to place them on the board to gain maximum points, by making use of the bonus squares (double letter, triple word, etc). It is also possible to gain extra points by creating (and scoring) two or more words at the same time, e.g. by pluralising an existing word or running a new word parallel to one already on the board. New players quickly pick up these skills.

Sunshine Coast Scrabble Club meets at Nambour RSL at 1pm on Fridays. Games, while competitive, are low key with an emphasis on simply enjoying the game in the company of other

New players are very welcome and are given a gentle introduction, as the first game is always played "open book" (i.e. players are allowed to check legality of words before playing them).

#### Easy fixes could add multiple spaces to Palmwoods parking

A lot is said about parking, or lack thereof, in Palmwoods. No-one really uses the deck

on the far side of Little Main Road so it is a pity that the road was not made a tiny bit wider with angled parking against that far kerb.

Such a move would have turned some ten parallel parking spots into a possible 18 or 20 and left the front/ façade of the old heritage shops unobstructed. Anyhow it is a done deal now so pointless to re-hash it. I had only been resident here a very short time when the realignment of the street was started and, although various plans were shown and comment invited, it was very hard to visualise the end effect. With my experience since...well perhaps my comments would have been disdained, anyway and, as I have said, it is a done deal.

In Margaret street there is a mix of angled and parallel parking and I feel that with the very wide road margins it should be easy to realign most, if not all, the parallel parking as angled parking.

I have a picture taken from Google Earth that I have annotated to illustrate the point and show that, as few as it may seem, we could have around



another +/- 12 parking spots along the centre of the town. — Erik Eilertsen, Palmwoods

#### Re: Rail duplication to Nambour won't happen (SVG, 18 August).

I have long campaigned for rail duplication to Nambour for very valid reasons.

It's not because I don't want to see the Beerwah to Caloundra to Maroochydore (CAMCOS) rail built. I do.

CAMCOS was promised to be built by the Bligh Govt to reach Caloundra by 2015 and to Maroochydore by 2020.

But if you asked me to choose which is more important for the Sunshine Coast, the state and the nation, the answer would be duplication to Nambour.

Why, because of the Commonwealth and State Govt reports that explain the need to rid us of this single track bottleneck and because it has an economic advantage.

Passenger rail does not have the same economic advantage.

Passenger rail is subsidised by the state by around 75%. For every \$1 we pay, the state pays \$3.

That said, I believe passenger rail is worthwhile.

It is why we pay our taxes so that we get the basic services that we need, being health, education and transport.

Governments don't only build railways to and for population centres, they build them for freight as ably demonstrated by the 1700km Inland Rail project being spearheaded by the Federal Government and the ARTC.

That vital freight project will make transit between Melbourne and Brisbane less than

24 hours. Supply lines are the lifeblood of every nation on earth.

cost billions is true, as would

To say duplication would

CAMCOS rail.

The cost of 39km of rail duplication Beerburrum to Nambour had an estimate of around \$1.8 billion back in 2011.

The cost of 40km of rail duplication Beerwah Maroochydore would likely be of the same magnitude, even if a greenfield site.

Coast residents DO drive to the rail line to catch the train to Brisbane, from all over the Coast.

On the subject of Fast rail (160-250km/h) via the recent North Coast Connect proposal, it was suggested to be a separate rail line.

It's unlikely to proceed given

Nambour has had a rough time economically, and has been suffering since the highway detoured around it.

Soon, it is going to lose the majority of workers from the old Maroochy Shire Council chambers site.

It does not have the pristine sandy beaches, surf and shops to draw tourists like the Coastal strip does.

A report commissioned by the Government and made by Arup Engineers dated 2007 stated:

Under the 'Do Nothing' scenario ..

"It is likely that the region would experience adverse socio-economic effects should the North Coast Line between Landsborough and Nambour not be upgraded."

The North Coast Line rail corridor width allows 4 tracks. It doesn't just serve the Sun-

shine Coast, it assists freight up to Cairns.

In short and I hope people will understand and not be offended, but Nambour and the hinterland and regional towns up to Cairns, need the economic boost, the Coastal strip, not as much.





What the Transport Minister didn't say was this was ANOTHER 'plan' in a very long conga line of glossy brochure programs and plans with projects that have gone predominately unfunded by his Govt, plan after plan.

Labor have been in power in Qld for 26 of the past 31 years, after subtracting the Borbidge (1996-98) and Newman Govt (2012-15) terms.

Before I continue, I have to give enormous credit here to the hard-working public servants and contracted consultants that spend hundreds of hours dutifully collating data, aggregating customer feed-back, preparing meaningful reports and concept maps and publishing them — in the vain hope that some of the plans may one day see the light of construction. They deserve a medal.

Very few plans make the cut and get funding. With reference to the unfunded plans, here are some examples.

In 2005, the SEQIPP 2005-2026 Part B Infrastructure Priorities and Projects anticipated that construction of the rail from Landsborough to Nambour would be completed by 2020.

It wasn't. No funding. 2008 saw the South East Queensland Infrastructure Plan and Program (SEQIPP) 2008-2026, released.

In hindsight it was more of a plan than it ever was a program.

"SEQIPP supports the Government's SEQ Regional Plan by outlining the long-term planning of infrastructure in SEQ. It includes the rail upgrade between Landsborough to Nambour to upgrade connectivity and increase the capacity of the NCL."

OK, that isn't happening by 2026. Why not? No funding.

2011 saw Connecting SEQ 2031. An Integrated Regional Transport Plan for South East It's 148 pages of ideas. It talks about a rail

revolution! Which is actually true because we're going (revolving) around in circles. The longer term plan proclaimed that by

2031 there'd be a Sunshine Coast line from Beerwah to Maroochydore (CAMCOS).

Like all the other prior plans, there's no money. I've read too many of these plans over the past 11 years.

2011 saw the 'Landsborough to Nambour Coordinator-General's report on the Environmental Impact Statement.'



#### Don't be alarmed ... but snakes are on the move

IT'S that time of year to take care when out in your back yard. WILVOS have started to receive a number of calls about snakes. WILVOS do have a list of snake catchers, or they can be found on the internet or in the yellow pages.

These people perform this service as a business, so it is recommended that a price is settled on. It's a good idea to find out who is in your local area and have the details handy. If someone finds a snake in the house, help is usually needed now!

One of our WILVO rescuers observed a carpet python, an eastern brown and a couple of tree snakes in his back yard last week. It is breeding time so snakes are on the move. Many people are not aware that sea snakes are as venomous as our eastern browns and should not be approached or handled if found on the beach or in shallow water.

One of our carers was horrified to find three pythons on her lorikeet aviary one night, see picture. Constant surveillance is needed with animals in aviaries to make sure the aviaries are snake proof. These amazing reptiles can get through the tiniest opening. Just having one on an aviary is enough to scare the inhabitants, so wildlife carers have to prevent this happening where possible. The use of night vision cameras have become a great help in observing the nightly adventures of wildlife in care.


