Towering opposition

Woombye rallies against proposed 40m high facility

WOOMBYE residents have united in signing a submission opposing a telecommunications tower proposed for near the town centre.

The response follows a campaign by Woombye Community and Business Association (WCBA) to ensure the community was aware of the proposal and calling on them to submit signed submissions opposing the facility proposed for 1-9 Campbell Street.

Some 330 submissions were handed in to Council's Development Services counter by last Friday's deadline, with more submitted by email.

The matter was first raised at a WCBA General Meeting, followed by a Saturday information street stall and a Special Meeting last Tuesday. In the three hours at the Saturday stall 142 submissions were signed, 55 percent by township residents, the remainder from the surrounding district and outside visitors. In the following six days a further 188 submissions were signed, 85 percent were township residents.

WCBA Vice President Grant Palethorpe said the WCBA set out to keep the issue local. "These types of applications are very topical and easy to get radio and TV media to sensationalise the story," he said. "Aside from one story in an earlier edition of the Sunshine Valley Gazette the WCBA did not seek widespread media coverage.

"Keeping it local rather than inflating numbers from a wide area was the aim. The submission focused on the impact on our local residents, as well as the effect on local businesses and sporting clubs."

The submission said the telecommunications tower would be in conflict with the strategic framework of Sunshine Coast Council's planning scheme which is intended to ensure only appropriate development occurs.

Mr Palethorpe said the 40 metre high tower would unduly impact on the amenity and landscape values of the area.

The submission objects on several grounds including visual amenity, heritage and safety, he said.

Friday was the end of the notification period. Mr Palethorpe expected a decision from Council by mid to late January.

"Council planning staff will now continue their assessment, and hopefully reach a decision to not support this approval."

He said the community had provided strong grounds upon which Council should reject the proposal. The public notification period is an important stage in Council's assessment process.

Submitters who lodged a "properly made" submission retain appeal rights against the final decision. "To collect 330 submissions in a seven day period is testament to how Woombye responded to a totally inappropriate location," Mr Palethorpe said.

The submission focused on planning merit and inconsistencies with the planning scheme. "A 40m tower located immediately adjacent to town does not minimise the visual impact and amenity of a significant number of residents, especially those in Cary, Hill, Campbell Streets & Paynter Park Drive," the submission says.


The submission says Telecommunications Facility Code AO1 required a separation distance of 400m from a telecommunications tower. Whereas 100 residential dwellings were within 400m of the proposed site. Of those, 50 were within 300m and the closest was only 80m from the tower.

"This application conflicts with multiple aspects of the planning scheme. The planning scheme is the mechanism that communities place trust in to ensure development is appropriate."



'We have a wealth of musical talent in this region and I love to support it," she said. "The shut down of the arts industry due to the pandemic has been devastating to small independent live music events like this. I am excited to finally begin bringing concerts back to my community."

is a new cohort of innovative contemporary classical musicians who share a passion for chamber music and believe that music is best shared up close and personal in private house concerts, small halls and unusual spaces.

"The artists actively seek new and unusual ways to engage listeners to classical music," says Louise. "Together they shine a bright light on the future of classical music. Music-making with friends and having the opportunity to share this with an audience who enjoy live music, is at the core of every concert program I curate."

Rychvalsky powers NYU to historic championship

NAMBOUR Yandina United Women's Premier League team created history last Friday (October 15) becoming the club's first Premier team to win a grand final.

Played in Caloundra in the fog and in front of a Red Army of supporters they won the McDonald's Women's Premier League decider 3-nil against Sunshine Coast FC Fire.

Coach Matt Croskerry said winning the first championship in the club's history made the occasion extra special. "The injuries definitely hurt us in the second half of the season but credit to the girls, they never stopped working or believing and they got their reward for the last couple years of good progress."

Croskerry said mentality was a big focus for the team going in to the final. "We spoke about not getting drawn in to the occasion and just playing the same brand of football that got us to the final in the first place. We knew Fire are a tough physical side, can defend really well and can be dangerous if given the space. Our game plan was to press high player-to-player and try and put all the pressure on them to force the mistake high up the field. We knew there'd be opportunities and when they came our attackers were clinical with all 3 goals being superb finishes."

Jasmine Evans scored a thunder volley while Kiara Rychvalsky scored 2 excellent long-range strikes. Rychvalsky was named Player of the Final

"Our back-line was resolute and kept the chances for Fire really limited. It was the first clean sheet we've had against Fire all season so they did really well."

Croskerry said the win was a special moment for the players many of whom had never won a grand final


"It really capped off a fantastic year for NYU with so many teams making the finals or winning their leagues, it's fantastic to see."

While the club ticked off a few 'firsts' this year they will now look to make that success sustainable.

"We will lose a few players to university and other commitments next year, but it's an exciting opportunity to bring in fresh faces. We've got some good young players coming through who deserve a chance and I think we may pick up 1 or 2 from elsewhere in the league."

He said the team appreciated the support it received from the Red Army. "Wherever we go, we always have the best support."



Inviting country, warm friendship kept them close

NOELENE Hughes and Maudie Garvey met in a little town in Canada in the 1960s. Last week the old friends, who have staved close all these years later, celebrated Maudie's 100th birthday with friends in Nambour and Marcoola.

"We've known each other for nearly 60 years," said Noelene. "We met in Canada and we're still living in the same area but on the other side of the world. There were big plans for her children to come and celebrate the centenary with Maudie but, of course, that's all gone by the wayside because of travel restrictions. We thought 'she can't sit out there at Woombye on her birthday' so we've organised a couple of special events for her."

Friends arranged for lunch get-togethers at Nambour and at Marcoola Surf Club.

Maudie was born in England on October 22, 2021 and enjoyed a globe-trotting early life living in exotic countries and cities including Canada, Bombay, Madras, Singapore, Kenya, Mombasa, Durban, Wellington NZ and Nassau.

In the 1960s Maudie and her husband Pat and children Marilyn and Kevin arrived in Gold River on the west Coast of Vancouver Island in British Columbia. As they settled into their new home, Maudie got a job teaching at the new Gold River Elementary School.

"It was one of the first open plan schools at the time and where I first met her," said Noelene. "We became great friends from then on and I even got to teach Kevin in Grade 1."

The new town was the first all-electric town in Canada and was carved out of the forest.

"Later I moved to Australia with my family and bought a property on the Sunshine Coast, said Noelene. "Maudie and her family came shortly afterwards. She and Pat bought a chicken farm at Eudlo and Maudie got a job teaching at Coolum State School. Imagine her surprise when she walked into her new classroom to find one of her pupils from Gold River, was now a pupil in her class on the other side of the world! The student, Bonnie, and her family had also decided to come to the beautiful Sun-

When her marriage ended Maudie and the children moved back to England and she taught for around 12 years. Later Maudie was drawn back to Australia to live and settled in Sydney near Marilyn. However the lure of the Sunshine Coast enticed Maudie back and she bought a house in Nambour surrounded by the country and friends she loved.

"Maudie joined many clubs here and also took classes at Retirement Villages to share her knowledge of Tai Chi with the residents," Noelene said.

"After suffering a fall, plans were made by the family for Maudie to move to Woombye Care where she has received wonderful attention from the outstanding staff there."




The Daniel Morcombe Foundation held the first Walk for Daniel in November 2005.

It is estimated over 1.5 million people across Australia will participate in Day for Daniel this year. This includes overt 5,500 schools and hundreds of businesses, public and private events.







world including Australia, the UK, Germany, USA, Japan, New Zealand and Singapore.

There have been many highlights along the way including a visit by Princess Diana and Prince Charles in the 1980s, the opening of The Ginger Factory tourist attraction in 1985 and more recently, the opening of The Gruffalo Trail which has delighted thousands of visitors to The Ginger Factory since it opened last year.

Terry celebrates amazing life

HE'S fixed historic clocks, mixed with royalty and restored antiques for famous politicians. Now globe-trotting engineer, Terry Butcher, calls Flaxton home. On Sunday he celebrated his 90th birthday with his family and about 50 guests and looked back on an amazing life.

Born in Perth to an Irish mother and Australian father Terry recalls a privileged upbringing as his father managed the Perth newspaper.

They moved to Sydney in 1934 and this was the first time he was able to cross the famous Sydney Harbour Bridge. That crossing turned in to a life-long interest and Terry has a huge collection of bridge memorabilia to this day.

Terry went to England in 1954 and worked for the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation as a film projectionist where he became friends with Australian actor Errol Flynn.

Around this time Terry was asked to show Prince Philip the new colour projection camera and the Prince was extremely interested in it and they both enjoyed the meeting. In 1961 Terry and his wife Jackie and son Rolf moved back to Australia, and Terry was working for Shell Australia. One of his jobs was to tour NSW showing a black and white movie, produced by Shell, called "The Back of Beyond". He was asked to show the then-Prime Minister Sir Robert Menzies a private viewing at his home.

Terry also worked on Australia's oldest clock at Hyde Park Barracks in Macquarie street in Sydney. He became the first man to stop the clock since it was erected there in 1819.

He bought the a home in Redfern - which housed a stable and a ball room and allowed him to work on restoring antique furniture.

His customers would visit him at his home. They included Prime Minsters Paul Keating and Bob Hawke, Governor General Bill Hayden and NSW Premier Neville Wran to name a few.

Terry made his final move to Flaxton in September last year for the warmer climate and to be near his daughter Sasha and son-in-law Benno Fenger. Terry's birthday party was held at Flaxton Gardens on Sunday (October 24).

Yandina Heritage walk brings history to life

The tour started from the Anglican Church built 1881 at 3 Farrell St and continued to the School of Arts Hall built 1916. It proceeded down Stevens St where Tom Rutherford Bakery was in the 1900s and Maylon and Nichols General Store in the 1930s.

It also took in the old Post Office site now occupied by Yandina CWA, George Best Senior's Butcher Shop and ES&A Bank which opened a branch in Stevens Street 1909.

The tour continued across to the Yandina Hotel which has been operating from site since 1891, the Cenotaph built in 1924, the Railway Station opened January 1 1891 and then headed back up Stevens Street to McNab Merchant and Excelsior House built by W. Lanham in 1909.

Finally it continued onto the corner of Stevens & Farrell Street and told the story of Michael O'Shea's General Store (1891) with current building built in the 1930s.

The Maleny op shop is Bloomhill's only secondhand store that's open seven days a week.


"Everyone who works here loves it, I personally enjoy the social aspect so much but also knowing all the funds we raise go toward supporting people with cancer," Portia said.



Gerry Zwart, OAM tribute:

Memories flow after passing of popular Nambour man

A gardening guru with a "heart for people" is being remembered for his jovial personality and tireless community service.

Gerry Zwart, 92, well-known for his community service in the Sunshine Coast hinterland, was remembered in Nambour on Friday, October 15, after he passed away on October 7.

Gerry's wife of 69 years Valerie said she couldn't imagine a life without him.

"The day we lost him was the worst day of my life, I really cannot think of anything that could have been worse," she said.

"But I've been blessed with him for a long time, so I can't complain about that, I thank the lord I had him for all that time."

The couple, who were sat next to each other at a carnival in a small Sydney seaside town, married three months after they meet in 1953 and were inseparable ever since.

"He was just my life partner we were very normal people we had arguments like others ... but we did agree on most things, the more important things," Valerie said.

'We had a good life.'

After a brief holiday to the Sunshine State the pair fell in love with the region and retired to Mapleton in 1989 where they became very active in the community.

Shortly after moving to Mapleton the Zwarts joined Friends of the Library and were devastated when the community facility was destroyed by fire.

They held many fundraisers including jazz nights, car rallies and cake stalls to raise a record amount of money to provide the community with a freehold library.

The Zwarts were also instrumental in raising money for Mapleton Community Hall and campaigning to keep the Old School House for the community.

Gerry also served as the president of Mapleton and Districts Community Association, was a founding member of Montville Visitor Information Centre and in 2015 joined his wife as an OAM recipient.

Like Valerie, Gerry had a lifelong passion for gardening that started as a child helping his mother grow food for his 12 siblings in Naziruled Holland.

After moving to Australia and getting married Gerry spent most of his working life in South Australia where he and Valerie worked at her brother and father's nursery.

He later became involved in the Sunshine Coast horticulture industry, ran the Plant Clinic at the Queensland Garden Expo for 15 years and along with Valerie wrote the Sunshine Coast Daily's weekly gardening column for many

"We were very blessed we had that lifetime interest in gardening and we loved every minute of writing for the Daily," she said.

Work for the blind

Despite all his achievements Valerie believed Gerry's proudest accomplishment was his time working for the Blind Society and Home for Incurables in South Australia.

"He travelled thousands of kilometres letting people know, who weren't going to get better, that there was a home for them," she said.

"I was so proud of him, he had such heart for people. He genuinely cared."

Gerry was described by his niece Cheryl Zwart as a bit of a prankster who was always having a good time.

Valerie said she was blessed to have spent her life with Gerry and was looking forward to the day when she was reunited with him and their daughter, Anna, who passed away from cancer

"He was an easy-going man ... he liked his jokes and a glass of wine when we got to the end of the day and we always had a few bottles tucked away so he could enjoy it," she said.

'We were very well matched, nobody knows if they are well matched when they get married and we were one of the very fortunate ones.'

Honoured for saving Jews from Nazis in Holland

In 2019 Gerry accepted Israel's highest honour on behalf of his parents Marinus and Marie. They were posthumously honoured as Righteous Among the Nations for their bravery in hiding Jews in their house during the German occupation of Holland in World War Two.

Gerry, who was in his early teens at the time, was heavily involved in the dangerous work while he grew up in the Dutch village of

"If they had caught a few Jews in our house, we would get the same treatment as the Jews, which was [to be] sent off to the concentration camps," Gerry said last year.

Israeli man Lex Menco travelled to Australia to be at the 2019 ceremony. Mr Menco and his four sons would never have been born if not for the brayery of Gerry's family. The Zwarts hid his mother Bela during the Holocaust.

Gerry recalled fleeing with a mate from German soldiers who had captured them to work in the factories. "The Germans were



yelling for us to come back and then they started shooting. You could hear the bullets hitting the trees around you," he told the Gazette last year.

Gerry's family saved at least five children. Bela van Praagh was one of them. She was three years of age when she was rescued and hidden. During the 2019 ceremony, Gerry and Bela (by video from Israel) shared recollections of their war years together as 'pretend' siblings.

Gerry was awarded an Order of Australia (OAM) in 2015 for his achievements and service to the community.

The Zwarts moved to Sanctuary Park Retirement Community in Nambour ten years ago.

He retained a quick wit and wonderful sense of humour. He was gentle, kind and generous with his time and knowledge.



Is saying 'yes' undermining your health?

IT may sound strange, but it's a common theme I come across in clinic. All. The. Time. Setting healthy boundaries. It can feel a bit gross just thinking about it, hey? But we have to go there, it's pretty important.

We often think of self-care in terms of bubble baths, candles, music, and sunsets - and don't get me wrong, these things are wonderful.

But real self-care is work. It's making yourself a healthy meal even when you're exhausted. It's going to bed on time even when you REALLY want to watch that next

episode on Netflix. It's getting up when your alarm goes off instead of hitting snooze 3000 times and then rushing to get to work on time. And, it's learning to say "no" to the things that don't support your

health and wellbeing. A lack of healthy boundaries can look like; saying "yes" to things you don't want to do to avoid feeling guilty or to gain approval, feeling pressured into getting involved or taking sides in others' (friends, family, co-workers) conflicts, allowing others to treat you badly in order to "keep the peace", repeatedly "coming to the rescue" for others' and being constantly "on call" for the next disaster.

Having healthy boundaries (or a lack of) is something we learn through the boundaries our parents or caregivers' model to us as children. Patterns of codependence, emotional enmeshment, guilt, and shame often travel with us through life, and are held so deeply within our subconscious they are often unrecognised -



feeding into a perceived identity of being overly kind and caring.

This is important because by the time these gorgeous humans come to see me, they're completely overwhelmed emotionally, struggling with dysfunctional family/work relationships, are completely burnt out and carrying a lot of resentment

They also typically have a long list of symptoms and diagnoses that appear completely unrelated (but often aren't), accompanied with unexplainable chronic pain.

If this resonates with you, it might be time to look a little deeper. What unmet needs are you filling with these unhealthy behaviours? Where do you need to start saying "no"?







On October 15 Council announced the successful applicants in its latest Major Grants program, with more than \$604,000 supporting 84 local projects.



care. It can be a time-consuming process but it is a joy to see with any wildlife. Besides those animals that come through our WILVOS Hotline, we also appreciate the time taken by wildlife facilities and vets in assisting us in the reuniting process by getting address details.

Often with plover chicks, the last one to hatch has trouble keeping up with the rest of the family. They can be left behind, later to be found in a weak state. They usually perk up quickly with warmth and nutrition.

Unlike many other young birds masked lapwings don't need to be hand-fed. If they are slow to start pecking at their food there are always a few tricks to get them going. Little bantam chicks soon show them how to pick up from the ground. Earthworms and insects in shallow water soon have them snapping up the bugs! Tapping on the ground with a couple of chopsticks held up beside the chicks even works. Well, they look a little like the parents legs! Wildlife carers become very inventive.

This week, one little plover named "Downunder", found a new family once he regained his strength. He went from 20 to 40 grams in a matter of days. Then the search was on for a family to adopt him. Incredibly, the adult plovers are quite happy to accept new chicks if they are about the same size as their own. "Downunder" happily joined his new family and his carer could not tell which chick was him. A perfect scenario. All our wildlife are special, and we are very lucky to still have them around.

You may recall my last column began:

A Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) analysis shows a rollingstock expansion of up to 65 extra six-car trains will be required over the next 10 years.

Fast forward to Wednesday 20 October at 10:43am where the Premier and Treasurer outshone the Transport Minister to announce a massive spend on 65 new six-car trains.

The Transport Minister, Mark Bailey tweeted the big news later at 12:19pm.

Limelight can mean darkness for others sometimes.

Maybe we'll finally get the nine daily trains that the Annastacia Palaszczuk government's Deputy Premier promised us in 2015, to arrive in 2016 (when the Redcliffe line was opened).

These trains were supposed to remove the 75 weekly rail-buses that clog 54km of our roads between Nambour and Caboolture, while pretending to be our trains.

That was another broken promise in the conga line of broken promises that we've faced over the past two decades.

Perhaps the state representative columnist to my left (see what I did there), might like to ask his Premier and Transport Minister why they never fulfil their rail commitments to our region?

We have been told or had planning documents state we would have rail to:

- · Landsborough by 2012;
- Caloundra by 2015;
- · Nambour by 2016;
- · Maroochydore by 2020.

Given their record - can we on the Sunshine Coast ever believe anything they say?

That said - it really is good news that we are getting new trains and I thank the Government for their decision.

What concerns me is the announced investment cost of \$7.1 billion.

I'm not sure how smart that is if you're trying to get the best price for the product.

It's like yelling out that you're going to build a \$7.1 billion house and then wondering why all the tender prices you let come in at around \$7.1

We know that the new trains are to be built in Torbanlea, a town 26km north of Maryborough.

The state government has selected the land and the Premier said there will be a \$239 million purpose-built, publicly-owned, train manufacturing facility on the site.

It appears the state Labor government are going into BIG business.

We know the cost is to build and operate the trains and that will include a maintenance component for the life of the rollingstock.

The most recent \$4.4 billion NGR train contract for example, includes a maintenance contract of 32 years.

If we subtract the \$239 million factory from the \$7.1 billion investment, that leaves a \$6.861

Divide this figure by 65 six-car trains and they end up averaging \$105.6 million each.

The NGR trains were part of a \$4.4 billion overseas contract, and the 75 six-car trains averaged \$58.7 million each, including their 32 years of contracted maintenance at Wulkaraka.

The three tenderers will be Alstom, CAF and Downer Rail.

The winner to be announced in the second-half of 2022.

Let's hope we get truly competitive prices.


